

The Romans celebrated Lupercalia from 13-15 February. It honored the wolf that suckled Romulus and Remus (you can see her on the bottom right in the picture) but also a Pan-like god called Lupercus (up on the top right).

Plutarch describes it thus: "At this time many of the noble youths and of the magistrates run up and down through the city naked, for sport and laughter striking those they meet with shaggy thongs. And many women of rank also purposely get in their way, and like children at school present their hands to be struck, believing that the pregnant will thus be helped in delivery, and the barren to pregnancy."

Officer Reports

<u>Seneschal</u> – At Unevent, told that officers have to be careful discussing the SCA on Facebook/social media. Nothing disrespectful. Or they could be removed from office. Applies to posts under mundane or SCA name, personal account or baronial. Does NOT apply to anything outside the SCA. Inflammatory USA political posts – OK. Inflammatory SCA political posts – Not OK.

We have The Comfort Inn as a business meeting site until March. Need to look for new meeting site. Silver Spring site is free, but concern is what if Magnus and Isabella can't be there to allow us to use it. Gracie suggests if we had to, we could rent a place at need. We will have Feb meeting at new site to see how it works out, roll current reservation at Comfort Inn to April. Hanna will confirm with Magnus and Isabella that they are available. Want to keep 3rd Sunday timing.

Lady Alicia's Cookery Booke: St. Valentine's Candies

Greetings, all! February is soon upon us and there is already much bustling in the servants' hall about the upcoming St. Valentine's Day feast. As the story goes, good king Henry VIII was the first to establish St. Valentine's Day as a national holiday, back in 1537. Sadly, this is most likely apocryphal – the holiday long existed as a religious one, even Martin Luther cited February 14th as St. Valentine's Day in 1537. While much has already been covered about Roman wolf-based fertility feasts and headless, note-passing saints, St. Valentine's day emerged as a romantic holiday from the medieval courts of love, based on the contemporary legend that birds chose their mates on February 14th. Chaucer was the first to cite this in his poem, *The Parlement of Foules*:

For this was on Seynt Valentynes day, Whan every foul cometh there to chese his make.²

Courtly medieval couples would randomly select the name of a "sweetheart" to whom they would address poems, send small gifts and revere in the courtly style. Later, Tudor lovers would also exchange similar tokens of love including sweets and candy (though the heart-shaped box of chocolates wouldn't come along for several more centuries, alas).

Sugar grew in popularity in the later Tudor age, though initially it was used medicinally. According to Tudor Humoral Theory, sugar is a "warm" food, which made it desirable in the winter months to warm a person up. Flavored sugar-paste comfits and sugar-coated seeds were prescribed for many different conditions including indigestion, which is why they were also served at the end of Tudor dessert courses, to aid in processing the hefty feast you had just consumed. Eventually these sweets were consumed apart from their medicinal purposes as a sweet on their own.

One of the easiest Tudor candies to make is sugar-paste comfits. Sugar paste is a compilation of sugar, egg white, rosewater, lemon juice and gum tragacanth. Dame Alys has an excellent redaction of the recipe from Thomas Dawson's *The Second Part of the Good Hus-wives Jewell*, listed below. If you don't happen to have any gum tragacanth handy in your pantry, you can also purchase pre-made sugar paste at most large craft stores that have an extensive cake-decorating section.

However you get your sugar paste, you would then add your medicinal/flavoring/coloring components (you can use commercial food coloring and a couple drops of peppermint or other extracts, to your taste) and mix thoroughly until they are evenly spread throughout the paste. You can either roll the paste into small bean-sized balls or roll the paste out approximately ¼" thick and cut into ½" diamond lozenges. Place on a plate and allow the candies to dry undisturbed in a warm, dry spot until hardened. From-scratch sugar paste dries very quickly, while modern sugar paste contains glycerin, which allows for a longer work-time, but also a longer drying time. The finished product should be hard and dry, depending on weather conditions, within 24 hours or so. The final candies will have a taste similar to

modern conversation hearts or Necco wafers.

You may give your newly-made sweets as a St. Valentine's gift to your sweetheart. Or you can keep them all to yourself, for medicinal purposes, of course: You want to be sure all your humors stay in balance and you stay warm through the chilly winter months!

Enjoy! Go out and cook good food!

Dame Alys' Redaction of Sugar Paste/Plate (from The Second Part of the Good Hus-wives Jewell)

2-3 teaspoons lemon juice

1-3 tablespoons rosewater*

1/2 lightly beaten egg white

1/2 or 1 teaspoon gum tragacanth

up to a pound or so of powdered sugar (3 1/2 to 4 cups equals approximately one pound)

*The amount of liquid needed varies depending on the type of sugar used, the humidity of the day, how much tragacanth you used, etc. Be flexible. You can use water instead of large amounts of rosewater. The resulting tragacanth mixture should be slightly runny, not stiff or with lumps. Place the tragacanth at one side of the bowl with the liquid next to it. Slowly mix the powder into the liquid to avoid lumps. Add more liquid as needed.

Soak the gum tragacanth in the rosewater until it softens. (Warming the rosewater may facilitate the softening.) Mix it with the lemon juice and egg white. Add the powdered sugar bit by bit, mixing well. If it becomes too stiff and there is a great deal of sugar left, add the remaining part of the egg white. Knead the dough on a powdered-sugar-sprinkled board until it is smooth and stretchy. Then use it to shape what you will. Keep the unused portions and any scraps well covered under a glass jar, in a plastic bag, or under a slightly damp cloth. (If the cloth is too damp the paste will begin to dissolve. You can add more powdered sugar and re-knead.)⁴
