

Of Business-

Financial Committee—We are still finalizing the exact numbers, but have noticed a few trends: (1) The average event seems to make between \$50 and \$200 profit. Occasionally we make more and occasionally we make less (or very rarely a loss), but most events fall in this range. This means Storvik has been making a total of about \$1000.00 total profit from all the events each year for the last several years. (2) Storvik has been spending about \$500 on misc. minor operating expenses and about \$1000-1500 in special projects each year for the last several years. (3) This means that even though most events are making a profit, we are still spending about \$1000 more each year than we make. So over the last 3-4 years, we have spent almost all of the \$4000 balance we had in the bank four years ago. Thus the need to raise more money for the Barony. (4) Several ideas for raising money are being pursued in parallel, including the Donation Jar at fighter practice, collecting items for a charity auction, and raising event registration fees.

Storvik Baronial Encampment at Pennsic XXX—There does seem to be sufficient interest to have an encampment at Pennsic, so the Barony agreed to do this. Over the next month we need to decide on which blocks of land to request, what sort of arrangements we want to make for food & other group services, and the logistics necessary to make all of this happen. Many final decisions on these issues will be made at the next Barony Meeting.

Fighting: The King's Champion will be named from the field of heavy fighters competing in the prize tournament. The Queen's Champion will be named from the field of fighters competing in the rapier tournament.

The Ladies of the Rose will sponsor a melee prize tournament for the heavy list to raise monies for the Their Majesties. The format of the tourney will consist of a three or five man heavy team tournament (size of the team depending on the level of participation). The populace can support their teams by bidding (donating money) that their team will overtake all others. The bidders, based on where their team placed in the tourney, will get to choose from a wide array of wonderful prizes donated by the Ladies of the Rose.

Arts and Sciences: There will be A&S competitions held for basic scrolls for the kingdom and a display for "All Things New.". The following scrolls will be included in the Scroll Competition: Silver Nautilus, Kraken, Shark's Tooth, Hippocampus, Sea Urchin, Award of Arms, Queen's Order of Courtesy, and the

A delicious feast will be prepared for up to 224 individuals. Merchants welcome but must register in advance with the merchant coordinator; \$10 fee for merchants.



Barony of Storvik: Coronation of Havorsh and Mary-Grace—April 6 to 8 (Continues)

Directions:

On I-64 west of Richmond, VA, take the Oilville/Goochland exit (exit 167). Go left on Rte 617 which will dead end on US Rte 250 west (0.8 miles). Go right (west) on US Rte 250 to Rte 632 (0.8 miles). Turn left on Rte 632 and proceed to Rte 522 south. Go about 0.4 miles and turn left. Proceed to Rte 6 (at Goochland Court House) about 5.2 miles. Turn right (west) on Rte 6, continue west on Rte 6 (about 3.3 miles). At the "Rock Castle-Westview" sign, turn left onto Rte 600. Proceed about 4.8 miles on Rte 600 (from this point, Westview has directional signs along the route). Turn right on Rte 643 (Westview Rd). The camp entrance is about .3 miles on the left. Look for Westview signs.

There will also be an armored combat tourney, an A&S competition (Italian Ren garb and accessories such as masks, cod pieces; hats, etc) and children's activities. Following the feast, there will be a masked ball, a candlelight Bocce tourney and a late night bardic circle around a roaring fire.




