

- 4) 3 remaining chairs need to be finished so they can be auctioned off.

Officers' Reports (Continued)-

Exchequer – Need a replacement NOW. \$3,205.66 is ending balance for February. Need to make more money. No income from performer's revel although there was an advance for food. Event report was filed. No site fee was charged so there is no non-member surcharge. Orlaith volunteered to be new Exchequer and no one else wanted job. So she got voted in. Fredrich thanked Gauss for service as emergency stand in for exchequer.

Herald – Nothing to report.

Knight Marshall – (Announcements at fighter practice to encourage donations to help pay for site) Fighter Practice site costs \$1,020 a year or \$85 dollars a month and last year we got \$230 in donations from fighters. The donation jar for the last 2 months totaled \$44. At Curia Cuan announced a regulation change. Staring in September there is to be no exposed plastic armor. Actual text of the rule is still being worked on and will be printed in the Acorn. Exceptions will be made for hand protection from the sounds of things. There was discussion of the new rule on the Armor Archive, Raw Metal and the Iron Rose.

Anyone who wants to teach a beginner level course should talk to Perrin. There will be equestrian activity, seige engines; will try to have siege engine range so people who are not authorized can try it out. Wanting to offer site for Kingdom War practice. This will be one of the last events to authorize before Pennsic. Even if not doing Northern region war practice can still have a practice on Sunday. Can also have either a Northern region war practice or a regular practice after Baronial Birthday.

There is a fragile truce in the Holy Land. Crusaders and Arabs alike are enjoying a break in the hostilities by gathering for a day of fellowship and feasting. Come for a day of celebration, demonstrations of skill at arms and arts, and good cheer.

The day will see both individual and melee armored competition. The tourney will start at noon after any authorizations. A target archery competition will also be held during the day. During the afternoon, classes in Beginning Middle Eastern Dance, Middle Eastern Line Dancing and Period Middle Eastern Costume will be offered. There will also be three Arts and Sciences competitions: a contest for the most authentic Crusader or Middle Eastern garb; the second will be a contest for forms of illumination depicting passages or relics of the Crusades (done in either language); & finally a competition for either song or poetic verse depicting something dealing with the Crusades. For all of these, documentation is suggested but not required. All entries are welcome.

A silent auction that has been progressing on the Merry Rose will continue during the event: A four-course late-period meal for four prepared by Minowara Kiritsubo-no-Ason and Baron Phillip of Ghent, to be served at Pennsic. All proceeds will go to the American Cancer Society. The winning bid will be announced during Baronial Court.

A delectable evening feast of Middle Eastern, European and Jewish fare will be prepared by Laird Muirghen Ruadh. The menu is designed to reflect all of the cultures that might have been present at a gathering such as this. Middle Eastern dance performances will be presented during dinner, and there will be opportunities for those who attended dance classes in the afternoon (or dancers who are a bit "rusty") to dance as well.

The event will be held at St. James Parish in Lothian, MD. It will open at 11:00 am and close at 11:00 pm. The site is discreetly wet.

Take your best route to Interstate 270. (Northwest of Washington DC) Take exit 16 Route 27 East towards Damascus. Angle right at junction for Rt. 108 through town of Damascus. Make left onto Mullinix Mill Road. Go straight at junction of Long Corner Road. Site is first left after Long Corner Road.

May 10--Storvik: Knightly Day on the Mall

Storvik has been granted permission to use the National Mall (south of Constitution Ave, between 14th and 15th streets) to host an SCA Demo on May 10 from 8am to 6pm. For the demo we are seeking attendance of Heavy Fighters, Fencers, Performers, & Artisans to amuse the crowd, & to demonstrate activities available in the SCA

Our land has been divided into four areas: The 1st & 2nd sections are tournament areas for heavy fighters & fencers. All interested fighters contact me. Lord Perrin (Storvik Knight Marshal) will be the marshal-in-charge for the day. The 3rd area is for performances; This would be dancing, acting, singing, etc. I wish to organize this as follows: The "leader" of a group willing to demo contact me with a preferred time allotment; I will schedule them for. The 4th area would be for A&S display by showing them on a table, or thru live demo.

Some of the things to keep in mind about the site:

- 1. Bone dry
- 2. We provide no food or drink to spectators. We can however keep some for ourselves.
- 3. No archery
- 4. No live steel; "Olympic style fencing" equipment is allowed (so fencing foils, epees, sabers, and schlaggers are ok as long as they pass SCA Fencing Marshal inspection).
- 5. All fencing weps. must be in a bag until they are on the list field
- 6. SCAdians cannot mix with the crowd wearing armor or fencing equipment.
- 7. Only rattan weps. for heavy are allowed (no fiberglass spears).
- 8. We need to provide our own chairs and tables.
- 9. There is no parking, but we can arrange a drop off point since we are bordered on 15th street.
- 9.1 Special parking arrangements can be made if necessary contact Abel; and there will be at least one truck that can transport armor
- 9.2 At the Storvik practice on Monday Night at May 5th there will be a truck available to load armor into to be transported to the Mall that Saturday morning.
- 9.3 I will try to arrange something similar for those in Ponte-Alto and cannot attend the Monday practice.
- 10. The National Park Service reserves the right to open any bag, box, etc.....
- 11. The demo will SHUT DOWN if Homeland Security issues a CODE RED. This can happen during the event.
