Join other archers in Royal Round shoots, and if time permits, we'll track down some of those animals that eluded us last fall. In the event of rain, gentles may exercise their bows on a short indoor range. We also have tentative plans for combat archery authorizations and practice, and a post-revel is scheduled.

The site will open at 9 am, with activities scheduled to comence one hour later. The site is discreetly damp within the minihall only. [drinking and shooting do not mix, please show restraint and caution]. Aside from one small and distant spring, the site is otherwise waterless; please bring your own liquids.

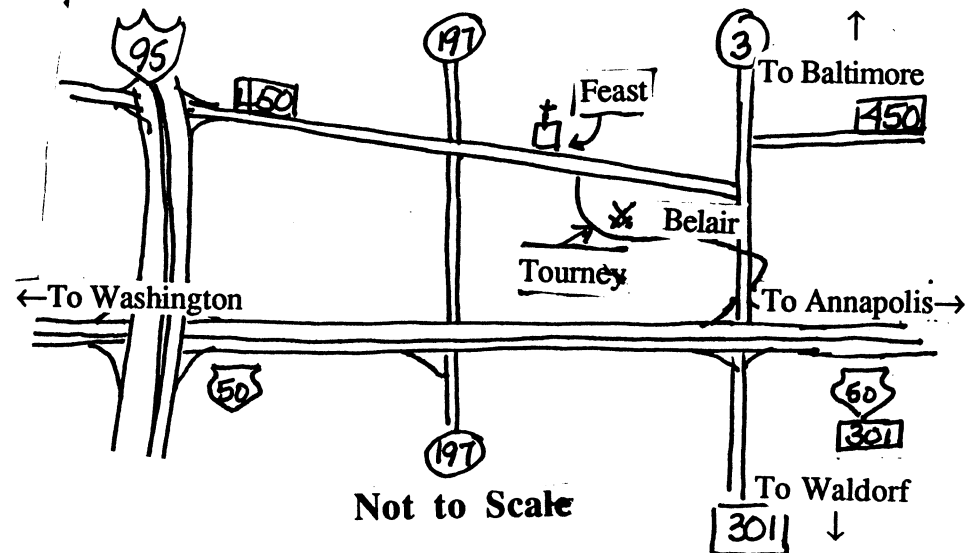

Heraldic and Scribal Symposium 1991

Kingdom of Atlantia June 27-30

The 1991 Known World Heraldic and Scribal Symposium will be sponsored by the Barony of Storvik, in the Kingdom of Atlantia. Diverse activities for both beginning, intermediate and advanced heralds and scribes will be offered.

Scheduling: Thursday night there will be a small party/reception for people who are already on site. On Friday during the day there will be tours of DC and a formal reception at night. If there is sufficient interest, classes will be held on Friday. On Saturday the classes will be divided as: two tracks of scribal, one track of onomastics (names and naming practices), one track of advanced heraldry, and one track of basic heraldry. Saturday evening we will go off site for a feast and revel. There will be parties in the hotel when we return. Sunday will be the Laurel meeting and more classes.

Speakers: Dr. Gerald Brault, author of Early Blazon, has agreed to come and speak. Dr. Jeri Fleck (Geirr Bassi Haroldsson) will speak on Norse Onomastics. Mistress Aelfwyn Grythdottir has agreed to teach a class on Anglo-Saxon onomastics, and Mistress Keridwyn (Lady Harpy) will teach on some aspect of Welsh onomastics. Lord Talan, Dragon Principal Herald of the Midrealm, will be teaching a class on doing name research in a language with which you are unfamiliar. Master Bruce Draconarius will teach a heraldic class.

The Site: The site is the Holiday Inn, Laurel, in Laurel, Maryland. For those who wish to stay in the hotel, room rates are \$50.00 a night for up to four people in a room.

The hotel is close to Baltimore/Washington International airport, and we are arranging a van service from the airport. It is even possible to arrange to get people from National or Dulles, although that will be a bit more difficult.

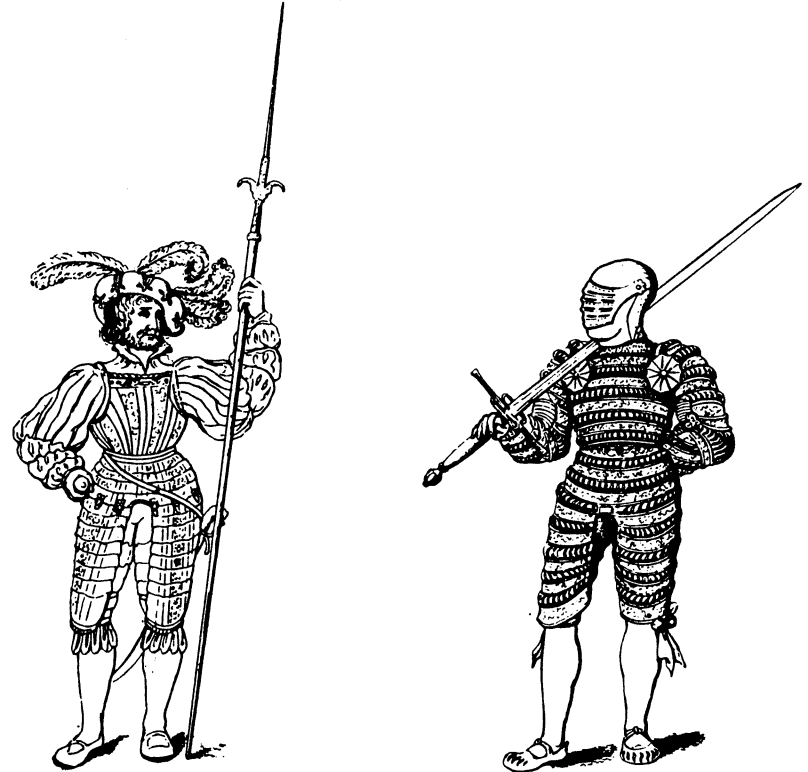

Barony Heraldic Report

Antoine D'Aubernoun: name and device accepted. Per bend Or and Sable, two lyres countercharged.

Brian du Bois Breton: badge rejected for conflict with the British 91st AGRA: Vert, a stag's head in trian aspect to sinister Or.

Cennydd the Wanderer: name accepted.

Ciaran O'Conaire: name accepted.

Elian Tawedog: name accepted.

Elizabeth Katherine of Sterling: name and device accepted. Per Pall argent, gules, and purple, on a quiver containing two arrows Or, a heart gules.

Gwaeddan o Ystrad Llangollen: name and device accepted. Or, two foxes sejant respectant gules, a bordure embattled sable.

Herveus d'Ormonde: name and device accepted. Vairy sable and argent, a phoenix gules rising from flames proper within a bordure gules. Badge accepted: A phoenix per pale vert and Or.

Kathe von Linz: name only accepted, badge rejected because the color emblazon showed the horse as plain brown, not bay, and there is no "proper" for the pack on the packhorse.

Magdalene Galway: name and device accepted. Per pale argent and vert, a rose barbed and seeded and a bordure rayonny countercharged.

Megan O'Donnely: name and device accepted. Azure estoilly, a wolf couchant to sinister argent.

Niccolo Stefani di Firenze: name accepted.

Otho d'Auvergne: badge accepted. In saltire a garden rose slipped and leaved gules and a hammer sable.

Rosamund of Oakhill: name and device accepted. Or, two oak sprigs in bend vert, fructed proper, and a bordure gules semy of roses argent.

Sean MacKelly: name and device accepted. Per pale azure and vert, a weasel rampant and a border argent.

Sean Michael MacKay: change of device accepted. Gyronny wavy gules and argent, in chief two roses counterchanged.

Teresa Gabriella de Montoya y Sevilla: name and device accepted. Per bend sinister argent and azure, a sunflower Or and a border counterchanged.

Their Excellencies also requested that I discover the whereabouts of a submission of several years ago, to wit: "The Baronial Seal" (A fieldless badge). The Triton Principal Herald quickly researched her files for me and determined that this badge had been rejected in September of 1989; and she even sent me a copy of the letter to that effect that had been sent out. The badge had been rejected on the grounds that a fieldless badge cannot consist of two independant, free-floating objects (in this case, a harbor seal and a drekkar). To the Lady Triton, my thanks. To Their Excellencies of Storvik: "Sorry! Back to the drawing board!"

My congratulation to all of you whose submissions were accepted. For those of you having difficulties in achieving acceptance of your submissions, please feel free to consult with either myself or any of the other fine heralds who serve this Barony.

Drekkar Pursuivant

the Third Crusade

1188 to 1192

In this year of our Lord, 1991, we gather to remember the deeds of our ancestors who fought and died in the Holy lands of the Middle East. Eight hundred years ago, the greatest armies of the middle ages, lead by the greatest kings of their times (Richard the Lionhearted, Frederic Barbarossa, Philip II of France, and the Muslim Saladin), fought for the control of the lands we call Israel, Lebanon, Syria, and Jordan today.

How was it that armies from Western Europe found themselves so far from their homes and families? What motivation was there that lead them to these places? The answer is religious fervor. With the rise of stature of the Christian Church in the 11th Century, came a desire to regain Christianity's most holy of holy symbols: the Cross of Christ (or the "True Cross" as it is usually referred to).According to legend it was believed to be hidden in Jerusalem.

In 1095, Pope Urban II speaking at the Council of Clermont (in France) called for a "Holy Crusade to regain the True Cross." He appealed to the knightly class and lesser nobility of Champagne. His timing was perfect. Due to the politic struggles in France during the first half of the century, a group of men whose main purpose was fighting had gained prominence. With the settling of many of the squabbles, the majority of these men (who knew little else besides the arts of war) became unemployed. Urban appealed to these, and offered to them a chance to do what they knew best and serve the Church at the same time.

Departing France in August of 1096, they passed thru the Byzantine Empire with the blessing and aid of the Byzantine Emperor Alexius. Travelling thru Asia Minor they fought the Seldjuk Turks and Arab Muslims, conquering : Nicaea, Antioch, the holy city of Jerusalem, and many smaller cities along the coast.

These lands captured from the Muslims were divided into four states: Edessa, Antioch, Tripoli, and Jerusalem; the first two states Edessa and Antioch, were ruled by Byzantium, while Tripoli and Jerusalem owed their allegience to the Latin Pope. Fed with supplies and fresh pilgrims (crusader knights as well as pious businessmen and peasants) the Christian states maintained their tenuous grip on the coastline until Christmas Eve 1144, when the Turks overran the city of Edessa and massacred many of it's inhabitants.

The attack proved to be the provocation of the Second Crusade, which although called for by Pope Eugenius III in December of 1145, did not actually leave for the Holy Lands until October of 1147. The combined French and German armies, without much support from the Byzantines and no naval force to transport them, found themselves forced marching across Asia Minor. A logistical nightmare in the best of situations, they were in tatters by February, 1148 due to severe weather conditions, scarce supplies, and attacks by the Turks that harried them constantly. The Crusade ended in defeat with the retreat from the failed attack on Damascus in July, 1148.

The failure of the Second Crusade caused much disillusionment in Western Europe. Many questioned the value of these eastern expeditions, and it was no small coincidence that it was nearly 40

years until the next Crusade began. From the 1150's thru 1170's the endangered Latin Kingdom of Jerusalem sent a series of emissaries to the west appealing for aid against the advancing Muslims. In 1165, Pope Alexander III re-issued the papal bull that had called for the Second Crusade and in the following year an income tax was levied in support of the Crusader states. However, despite the financial assistance, no western king was prepared to begin a crusade. In fact, Henry II of England and Louis VII of France were engaged in a bitter war over Henry's French possessions throughout the 1170's.

It took the ascension of Saladin to the Muslim throne and the increased resulting threat to the Crusader states to finally mobilize the west in 1187. After receiving the news of a disastrous battle fought at Hattin (July 1187), and the loss of Jerusalem to the Muslims lead by Saladin (October 1187), Henry II, his eldest son Richard, Philip II of France, and the Holy Roman Emperor Frederick Barbarossa "took up the cross," setting the stage for the Third Crusade to begin.

This is Part I of a several part series that will run approximately equivalent to the same time that the actual Crusade ran. Of course, we have some catching up to do. The next few parts will bring us up to date on the Crusade activities and include short bios on the principal players. We will be using actual correspondence from real Crusaders, along with contemporary historians, and modern summations.
