SCA Board of Directors Meeting in Storvik

The Board of Directors of the Society for Creative Anachronism will be holding its April quarterly meeting in the Barony of Storvik. This is a rare opportunity to see firsthand how the whole international organization is run. The Board only meets dour times a year, usually in California. April will only be the second time in 25 years that they have met in this area.

The meeting itself will be Sunday, April 26, 1992, at 10:00 a.m. in the New Carrollton, Md., City Hall. It holds 300 and is conveniently located about a mile from the Washington Beltway (Route 495). Take Route 450 East (Exit 20A) and immediately get in the two left lanes to turn left at the intersection onto Princess Garden Parkway. The City Hall is a few blocks ahead on the left in a brick building. No reservations or garb are necessary. Lunch will be available.

On Saturday evening, April 25, 1992, the Barony of Storvik will host a feast for all, with dancing afterwards. This will be a chance to meet the Directors informally, all of whom have a great deal of experience in the Society. During the day in the feast hall, there will be a display of items showing how we arrived at A.S. XXVI, with 20,000 members and 12 kingdoms, such as old newsletters, maps, artifacts, and photos. Those attending are encouraged to bring anything they may have of a similar nature. Dancing is also likely to occur in the afternoon as well. The hall will open at 2:30 with the feast at 6:30. 




