The Chronicler's Complaints

The Chronicler has a scanner! Isn't that wonderful? Well, it could be. Visit the bear gardens and the marketplace. Spend the morning painting a wallcovering, midday with the ladies at the stews, the afternoon having a leeching at the barbers. Should a fellow offend you with the shape of his ruff, demand satisfaction right there. But don't tire yourself — it's rumored the Spanish are planning a raid and every sword and bow will be needed to repel the raiders.

There will be merchants, games, bear-baiting, bull-baiting, a pope-burning. A tapestry will be painted in the hall. The two great houses are once-again plotting against each other. Duels will be fought, the seconds keeping a wary eye out for the constable. And, somewhere in town, a Spanish spy works to aid the marauders at sea. Assuming the town survives, a great feast will be held to celebrate our victory over the enemy.

While set in the Elizabethan era, all are welcome. A fully-developed persona isn't necessary — just the desire to have fun and enjoy the day. Fighting in the streets is all the rage. So put your rapier in a scabbard, your mask in a sack and go out and insult someone's heritage. Those Spanish raiders are tough; we'll need all the combat archers we can muster. Boffer weapons will also be on hand, so whether you're heavy, light, or in between, there will be fighting for all. For the non-combatants, gambling, shopping, games, and observing the carnage will keep you going til lunch. Should the Spanish attack, all will join in the battle, hurling stones, grenades, and taunts at the dogs.

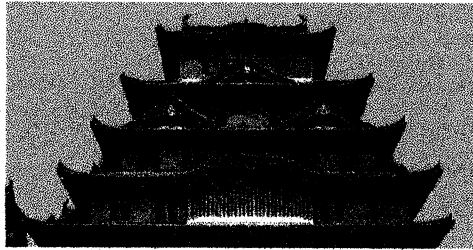

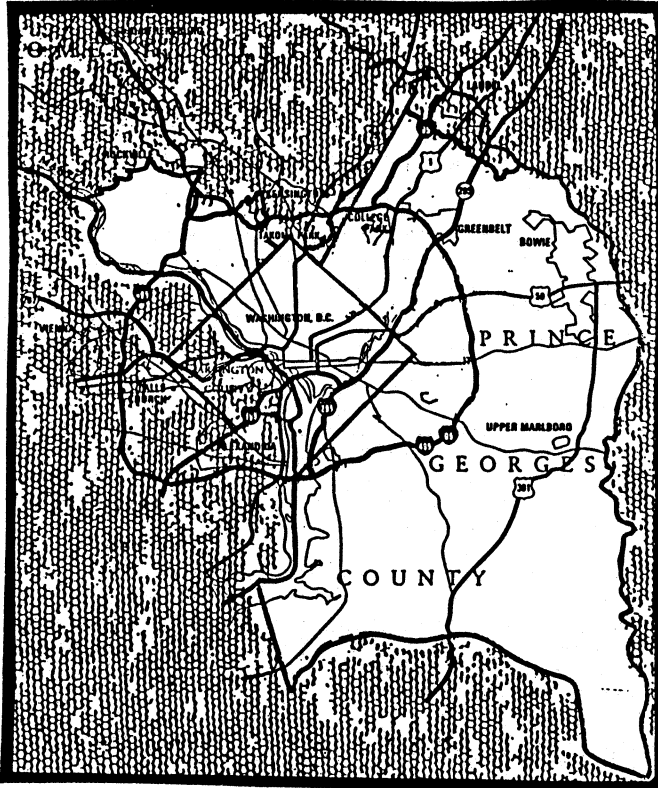
