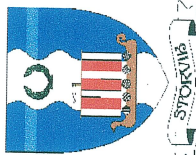

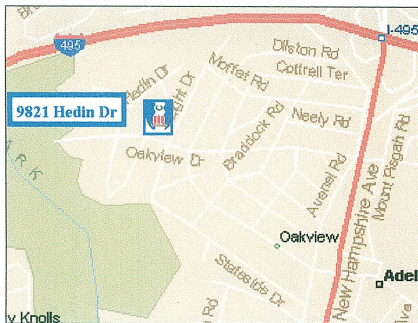

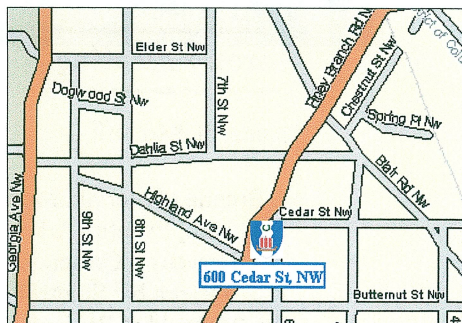

Feast Cost/Reservations: Please send feast reservations to the autocrat. Cost is \$10 for adults on-board, children under 12 on-board are \$6, off-board is \$4 for everyone. Please make checks payable to Barony of Storvik, SCA, Inc. MacGregor will be cooking.

Site Fee: There is no site fee for classes, donations to the University of Atlantia will be gladly accepted. Please make donation checks payable to the University of Atlantia, SCA Inc.

Site rules: No live steel, pets or alcohol. Wine is allowed at feast only. There are many lunch sources nearby (map available).

Merchants: The wide hallways can be used, but you must bring your own tables. We have to tell the university ahead of time what is being sold, so we require that you contact the autocrat at least 2 weeks beforehand.

Send reservations to the autocrat. Note that if there is a Phase 2 snow emergency in effect the event will have a delayed opening. If a Phase 3 snow emergency is declared then the event will be cancelled and rescheduled for a later date.

Arts & Sciences: There will be two competitions at this event. The first is best use of baronial colors. Please show off the best way you've used the Barony of Bright Hills' colors and possibly win the prize! (Documentation is always a plus.) The second competition will be for best creation of an indoors period game. There will be a prize for best creation of a game based on period sources from documentation, and space permitting use of the game. Entrants are encouraged to demonstrate how it is played for extra credit. (Note: There is not enough space to permit the playing of darts, a game of bowls or other activities that take large amounts of space.) Some of the guilds of Bright Hills will be displaying examples of their work for all to see. If time permits we may have a few classes.
