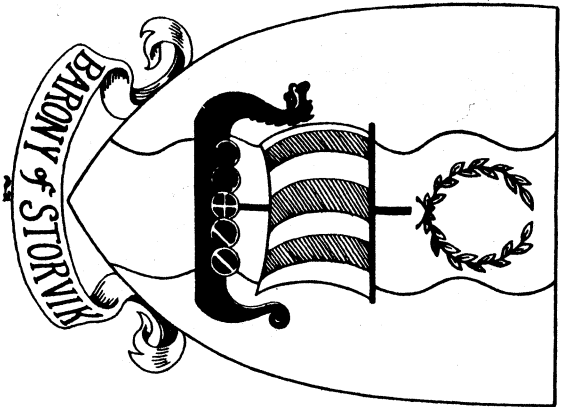

From the Capitol Beltway (I-495): Take New Hampshire Avenue South to Adelphi Road. Take a left onto Adelphi. After several miles, you will come to Route 410 (East-West Highway). Get in the right-hand lane, and cross over 410 onto Queens Chapel Road. Go through the light at the top of the hill, and make the next right onto Oliver Street. The address is 3603 Oliver.

From The City: Take North Capitol Street to Michigan Avenue. (Look for the signs to Providence Hospital and the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception). Turn right onto Michigan. Stay on Michigan when it leaves the District and becomes Queens Chapel Road. Oliver street is approx. 5.4 miles from the intersection of North Capitol and Michigan. You will eventually pass through a shopping district (a shopping center, gas stations, a Pizza Hut, etc). Queens chapel road then goes up a very noticeable hill. Oliver street is on the other side of the hill, at the bottom, on the left. If you reach Route 410 (East-West Highway), you have gone too far. If so, cross 410, turn around, and follow the "from the Capital Beltway" directions above.

By Metro: Take the Red Line to Brookland/Catholic University. Catch a R2 or R7 bus. If this is your first time by bus, go to Prince Georges Plaza (the bus will actually

go into the Shopping Center) and call me. Someone will pick you up. After the first time, I will show you the stop to get off. It is approx. 40 min. from Metro Center to my house during rush hour, a little longer afterwards.

COVER ART: The cover was taken from the "Missal of Saint-Denis", 1350-1351. The "D" was an "O" in the original and the Unicorn was a Stag. The "D" is from the "Brevairy of Charles V", 1358-1390. The Unicorn comes from the "Catholicon", also from the mid to late 1300's. The original is in color. The shading that I used to change the work to black and white simulates period techniques, most of which can be seen in the woodcuts and engravings of Albrecht Durer. In the original the stag/unicorn was being hunted and hid in a church where the hunters were unable to enter, and so the stag/unicorn was saved. This to me seems to well symbolize purity protected by the divine, as the beloved (the unicorn) is protected from all harm by hiding in the heart of the lover (the church).

Child Care. We plan to arrange babysitting, either at the site or in a nearby home. Space will be limited so we can only care for children whose parents have pre-registered them. The Heraldic classes currently scheduled include: Using the New Rules, taught by Mistress Alisoun MacCoul of Elphane, Laurel Queen of Arms; Heraldic Drawing, by Mistress Johanna von Griffenhurst; Comparative Courts, by Master Conrad von Regensburg, former principle herald of Caid; How to do Heraldic Paperwork (How to fill out Submission forms) for both the local herald and the submitter, by Lady Hilary Fairhaven; Periodic Heraldic Sources, by Master Allyn O'Dubdha; and How to Blazon, by Sir Cai de Lyon. There will be additional classes as well; see next months announcement or SASE the autocrat. Scribal classes currently scheduled include: Celtic Knotwork Made Easy by Lann of Cambion; Using Guache by Johanna von Griffenhurst; Black Letter by Bogdan Il'ich Volknoi. There will be additional classes as well; see next month's announcement, or SASE Lady Johanna von den Glocken.

The Site, Warner Memorial Presbyterian, will open at 9:00, with the first class at 10:00. There will be a lunch break at 12:00, with classes resuming at 1:30. Dinner, cooked by Baroness Elaina de Sinistre, will be served at 6:30, followed by dancing and socializing during the evening. Note: the site is dry.

Directions: Take your best route to the Beltway (I-495). Exit onto Connecticut Avenue North towards Kensington. Go approximately one mile. Warner Memorial will be on the right. There is limited street parking around the church; there is a huge parking lot (that belongs to the church) across Connecticut Avenue.

Portable Medieval Furniture

Start now, there's time to build good looking portable furniture in time for Pensic. Here are plans (on the foldout) and directions to build a simple six board chest and a trestle bench. These are simple designs requiring only a few tools. You will need a square, hand saw, hammer, sabre saw and a screw driver. A plane and chisel will be helpfull, but sandpaper can also be used to smooth the sawn edges. I suggest that you use pine to make both the chest and the bench for several reasons. Pine is relatively cheap, readily available, light weight, easy to work and finishes well. Poplar, which is harder than pine, is another possibility. From an authenticity standpoint, pine was used for much of the common furniture in the Middle Ages. There is little extant medieval furniture made from pine left today because pine is not as durable as oak. I suggest that you make these pieces from pine and if you like these designs then consider making additional pieces from oak or other hard wood if you can stand the cost and weight.

Before you begin, here are a few additional points not covered in the directions. The dimensions given on the plans match the dimensions in the parts lists and directions. However, they can be changed to suit your specific requirements. The dimensions of the chest should be adjusted so that the chest will fit easily into your vehicle. The bench, following these directions, can be made any length, but should not exceed six feet in length. One change in the directions to note: if you make the bench six feet long, then make the side pieces out of 1" x 4" pine. The notches in the legs will have to be adjusted to accommodate the wider side pieces. Changes in the 18" height can best be made by measuring the height of your favorite chair.

To begin, purchase enough wood to make all the pieces given in the parts list. Study the plans as you read the directions so you are familiar with each piece, where it goes and how it fits. Read the directions again. Make the cuts accurately so that the joints are tight, this is important for strength (especially for the bench) and for the final appearance.

The directions suggest using stain or paint to finish these pieces. Paint is most authentic. The Medieval mind did not have the same appreciation for the grain of the wood that we do today. They used paint as a means of decoration and decorated everything. Use bright colors of paint, Medieval paint was milk based, today true milk based paints are available, but are expensive and probably would not stand up to the weather very well. I suggest exterior latex

paint (which is also milk based), it is easier to find and comes in lots of bright colors. The bench can be painted all one color or the legs can be a different color. Paint the chest, first, one color all over, inside and out, then paint on your device or other decoration. Inside the lid of the chest, where it is protected, was a popular place for a nice painting.

If you are interested in building other pieces of furniture, such as tables, cupboards, hutches, settees, etc., I have many other plans and ideas. Please call on me if I can be of any assistance or if you have any questions. I would also enjoy seeing your finished chests and benches. Wonderful woodworking.

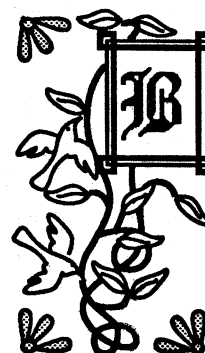
Ancient Lore in the SCA

or

It's Not Who You Know, But Who You Remember

One Man's Observations

anners of bright colors hang from the walls. The throng assembled is a sea of costumes and garb from days of long ago. Through the friendly din of the crowd, few people can hear the plaintive cries coming from the front of the great hall. There, a solitary person jumps up and down, draped in a brightly colored herald's tabard.

Many a good gentle reading this may well recall any number of past events in our great Society. Between the flurry of activities running smoothly on SCA time, small groups of gentles have gathered to indulge in some freewheeling conversation with friends and acquaintances. Joined in comradery, they may even wager on the blood pressure of the autocrat, who is making a strangling gesture toward someone unseen. Standing on the edge of any one of these conversations, listening to the subject - be it fighting, court etiquette or bobbing for cloved fruit - a phrase like "Do you remember when Lord Smith took those grapes and..." will almost inevitably be heard.

While listening to Lord Smith's unusual exploits, you may feel that the banter and fond recollections do not often include you. If you are a newcomer, no one may think to inquire if you "remember." You could get the false impression that people will only ask peers of the realm, the well known or the most deeply involved lords and ladies to help flesh out some tale of yore or refresh someone's failing memory. Often, however, the truth is simply someone else's unfamiliarity with you. People may not know how long you have been in the SCA, where you are from, or the type of events you frequent.

Even if you don't remember a particular incident, you may still be asked if you know a certain lord or lady. If you have not been a member for very long or have recently moved into the area, chances are that you don't. Although you may have met someone once or twice, matching a twelve letter, vowelless Welsh name with a face could be a problem. Hopefully anyone talking to you will have the presence of mind to ask who you know and fill in any missing information. Your unfamiliarity with a subject rarely restrains a good story teller. It just means he can be a little more flexible with the details.

As you become a more recognized face in the crowd, people will know with whom you are acquainted in the SCA. Eventually, you will notice the question "know" becoming less frequent and you are actually asked if you "remember" something in the past. This is a moment to be savored by the new member or transplanted lord or lady. You have become one of those who has "been around since", even if it hasn't been very long.

In the minds of many, there is a certain prestige associated with being a part of the Society from the beginning of time. Most who have accumulated untold numbers of awards, titles and scrolls through the years have gold-card memberships in the 'Old Fart's Club'. These are the people most often asked about long-standing traditions (those dating back at least two years) and events from the dim mists of time (longer than three years ago). While it is hard to match recollections on this level, having come from somewhere else may have it's advantages. You can weave your tales free of any worry that someone will pick up your small embellishments. However, don't overdo it or people will start to inquire as to the contents of your tankard.

It is a fact of our modern age that people may have to move from place to place or from realm to realm. An individual might make his or her mark in the world and then travel on. Left behind are only memories and a legacy to be passed on to future generations; tales of lore to be told over half-full flagons of ale for years to come. Each person who remembers, or says he does, adds a little more detail to the telling, whether it happened that way or not. Eventually reality becomes strained and it grows to the point where it can safely be told to the originator with only a

slight chance of recognition.

There may be some suspicion concerning the origin of these legends. One might well ask "Who could possibly have thought of using fruit that way?" and shake his head in disbelief. Do the oldest members come together and manufacture these people and fantastical events? No. I believe that thought can be easily discarded. In my wanderings through distant lands and far-away places, the people I have encountered in our Society make such fiction totally unnecessary. There is more than enough material to keep any lore master occupied for ages to come. I even remember when Lady....

From the Chronicler

Hope you like Sir Stanford's article on woodworking. The article was an experiment in Drekkar design - how to insert an article so that it could be of greatest use in the shop (or wherever). However, I am still in need of articles, so please, write.

I'm starting the revisions of the Tintinnabulum. Copies of the draft are being sent to sundry persons - chances are you know someone who does or who shortly will have a copy. More about this next month.

Next month I also want to open a public debate on a topic that surfaced in the minutes of the last board meeting - should the Society have a defined start date? I am looking for letters (generally no more than a page of closely typed text) both pro and con. I am willing to make space for them in the Drekkar over the next few months - one or two letters a month. I will probably write a letter myself. If you're interested, please call or write.

The new Corpora contains some changes relevant to how some things will be announced in the Drekkar. According to the revised Corpora,

"The term 'Society event' refers to . . . activities whereby participants can display the results of their researches into a period culture and technology in an environment which evokes the atmosphere of the Middle Ages and Renaissance. It also refers to educational activities . . . and meetings where participants share skills or discuss the business of the group. All Society events must be . . . conducted according to Society rules."

This means that all events, including fighter practices, are "events" and must be "conducted according to Society rules" including the rule that all fighting events must have a marshal-in-charge. Thus, for example, any fighting practice that does not have, at every practice, a marshal-in-charge (a person listed by Lord Cosimo as a qualified marshal) cannot be listed in the Drekkar (because any event so listed is, according to the new rules, a "Society Event"). As a corollary, events listed in Drekkar, but not in Acorn, are also Society Events - thus enabling us to have "local events" that do not appear in the Acorn (thus bypassing some other problems). So - if your favorite fighter practice no longer appears in Drekkar, contact Cosimo and work it out with him. If you have any questions, please contact either Lord Stefan or myself.

NOTES FROM THE JANUARY BARONY MEETING

The January Barony meeting was held on January 14 at the home of the Baron and Baroness.

OFFICER'S REPORTS: The HERALD had little to report. The MARSHAL indicated that the Marshalate will come out with a Marshals report form to facilitate the marshals reports from fighting events. All Marshals are to keep a separate notebook on all fighting events in Storvik.; This is to help speed up reporting to the Earl Marshal. Because of the new Corpora policies about what constitute "official events," the only official fighting practices (in Storvik) are the Monday night, Thursday night and Sunday. These are the only practices at which the Marshal's office is reasonably assured that a Marshal will attend. The LISTS Officer reminds all fighters to check their Fighter's Express Cards. The ARTS & SCIENCES Officer announced that her term was expired, and that by prior agreement Lady Therasa du Domremy was to take over A&S. However, because of her health, Lady Therasa may be unable to carry out the full duties of the office, though she is willing to

assume the position and carry out as many duties as feasible. The suggestion was made to put everything on "hold" and see if anyone was interested in becoming A&S. The EXCHEQUER reported that the Drekkar had \$611.96, and the Baronial had general funds of \$1190.38. The Exchequer reminded all autocrats, etc. to submit any outstanding reports ASAP as she must close the books for 1989 and draft the Annual Report. A new policy is announced by the Exchequer - NO PENNIES. It was amusing the first time - but let us not do it again (please). The Chronicler gave his annual report to the Barony. The subscription liability for the 1990 calendar year (as of 1/14/90) is 953 issues, for a dollar cost of \$476.50. With the estimated costs of the Tintinnabulum @ 187.50, estimated operating costs for the year will be 526.50. It was decided to adopt a "wait and see" attitude about additional funding (for the exchange & complimentary issues and the directory) as sufficient funds were in the account. The Chronicler's reports to the Exchequer were made. The Chronicler announced that he was beginning revisions of the Directory, and that copies would soon be distributed to the area chroniclers, heads of household, sponsors of activities and other notables. Also, mention was made of Cahan Kyle, and the inter-kingdom "regional" newsletter that he was publishing. The SENESCHAL reported that the new COPORA is out. The regional meeting of Seneschals and Chroniclers will be at the Fat Tuesday event in Bright Hills. The Agenda will discuss whether there should be regional meetings, and what the scope of those meetings (if such are to be held) should be, including possible coordination of kingdom/regional events, etc.

BARONY MEETINGS: The February Barony meeting will be on February 11, 1990 at 7:30 PM at the home of Lady Maura von Blitzbau. The March Barony meeting will be on March 11, 1990, at 7:30 PM at the home of Lord Stefan of Cambion. We need a site for the April meeting.

EVENT REPORTS: The autocrat for the YULE REVEL has turned in her paperwork. Due to some gentles who made reservations but who did not show (or pay), the event ran a small loss. The autocrat will try to encourage the gentles to pay up so that the event breaks even. There was no report for the CHRISTMASS BALL. There was no report for the PERFORMER'S REVEL, though the event is still on. CORONATION is going to be a big event. The site is Sherwood High (the old Northwood High). We will have to rent tables and chairs. We are also looking into using the auditorium for courts. The Ladies changing room is perfect (a dance room, with 3 walls of mirrors). There will be an Arts room, etc. The Baroness is looking

for volunteers, especially clean-up crew (who she encourages to do nothing but have fun all evening long - and then put in an hour or two cleaning up). The site fee is \$844.50. The Baroness is appealing to the households in re each running a separate event or tasking. Lady Siobhan (Chronicler of Lochmere) volunteered the aid of Lochmere. The ST. PATRICK'S DAY BLOODBATH will not be announce in Acorn, as Yarnvid will not grant us an exception to the 150 mile rule (we are scheduled opposite their Cooks Challenge event). We will do it as a local event, as per the new Corpora. The SCRIBES/HERALDS COLLEGIUM is O.K. They have a cook. Looking for teachers (scribes & heralds). The MAY FAIRE has still not yet confirmed a site. The autocrat is getting antsy about being site-less. There was no report for NOVICE TOURNEY, and the Barony is looking for an autocrat for the POST-PENNSIC REVEL. A discussion then ensued concerning TOURNEY OF THE TOWER. Lady Therasa is still looking for someone to act as Park Service Liaison - she particularly wants (gulp) a lawyer, or someone who knows lawyers (indeed, she had two particular gentles in mind). It seems that the Tourney has made it into a book that is distributed to secondary schools as an annual event of interest, and it would be ironic to cancel the event after that. There was no OLD or NEW BUSINESS.
