## A Proposal for a Northern Dance Class

Baron Kay is organizing a 13 week beginning dance class to start the first Wednesday or Thursday of February. From the Capitol Beltway (I-495): Take New Hampshire Avenue South to Adelphi Road. Go left onto Adelphi. After several miles, you will come to Route 410 (East-West Highway). Get in the right-hand lane, and cross over 410 onto Queens Chapel Road. Go through the light at the top of the hill, and make the next right onto Oliver Street.

From The City: Take North Capitol Street to Michigan Avenue. (Look for the signs to Providence Hospital and the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception). Turn right onto Michigan. It will become Queens Chapel Rd when it leaves the District. Oliver street is aprox, 5.4 miles from the intersection of North Capitol and Michigan. You will eventually pass through a shopping district (a shopping center, gas stations, a Pizza Hut, etc). Queens chapel road then goes up a very noticeable hill. Oliver street is on the other side of the hill, at the bottom, on the left. If you reach Route 410 (East-Vest Highway), you have gone too far. If so, cross 410, turn around, and follow the from the Capital Beltway directions above.

Directions: From the East Take I-270 to US-15 North. Take 15 to US-340 West. Exit at MD-17 Brunswick-Burkittsville. At the top of the exit ramp, turn left, and proceed one mile on Route 17 to the first full traffic light (a Sheetz gas station and a church will be on the right). Follow MD Route 17 into Brunswick (please note that at this point Route 17 hangs a right and may be under construction) for another mile until you find a yellow flasher. Make a left turn at the flasher and then an *immediate* right onto Maryland Ave. Go to the stop sign, turn right and go three blocks. The Brunswick Fire Hall is on the right side of the road and the parking lot is on the left.

From the South: Take your best route to Leesburg, VA and Route 7 West. Follow Route 7 to VA-9 West. Continue west 5 miles to the first full signal and turn right onto VA-287 and follow this into Maryland (across the Potomac) approx. 9 miles. You will find a flashing light after you cross the bridge. At this point, follow the SCA signs to the site (you are not very far).

## Heraldic and Scribal Symposium 1991 Kingdom of Atlantia June 27-30

The 1991 Known World Heraldic and Scribal Symposium will be sponsored by the Barony of Storvik, in the Kingdom of Atlantia. Diverse activities for both beginning, intermediate and advanced heralds and scribes will be offered.

Scheduling: Thursday night there will be a small party/reception for people who are already on site. On Friday during the day there will be tours of DC and a formal reception at night. If there is sufficient interest, classes will be held on Friday. On Saturday the classes will be divided as: two tracks of scribal, one track of onomastics (names and naming practices), one track of advanced heraldry, and one track of basic heraldry. Saturday evening we will go off site for a feast and revel. There will be parties in the hotel when we return. Sunday will be the Laurel meeting and more classes.

Speakers: Dr. Gerald Brault, author of <u>Early Blazon</u>, has agreed to come and speak. Dr. Jeri Fleck (Geirr Bassi Haroldsson) will speak on Norse Onomastics. Mistress Aelfwyn Grythdottir has agreed to teach a class on Anglo-Saxon onomastics, and Mistress Keridwyn (Lady Harpy) will teach on some aspect of Welsh onomastics. Lord Talan, Dragon Pri cipal Herald of the Midrealm, will be teaching a class on doing name research in a language with which you are unfamiliar. Master Bruce Draconarius will teach a heraldic class.

The Site: The site is the Holiday Inn, Laurel, in Laurel, Maryland. For those who wish to stay in the hotel, room rates are %50.00 a night for up to four people in a room.

The hotel is close to Baltimore/Washington International airport, and we are arranging a van service from the airport. It is even possible to arrange to get people from National or Dulles, although that will be a bit more difficult.

For anyone who does not wish to stay in the hotel, or who cannot afford to, there is ample crash space in the area. There is also ample crash space available for anyone who wishes to come early to the event, or leave late, or take advantage of the event to see the Capital (including the Smithsonian Museums, the Library of Congress, the National Archives, the Capital, the Washington Monument, etc.).

#### National Gallery Exhibits A review by Master Conrad von Regensburg

With all the (justifiable) excitement over the simultaneous Titian and Van Dyck exhibits, there are a couple of other special little exhibits going on that have tended to be overlooked. They are: Eva/Ave: Woman in Renaissance and Baroque Prints and The Art of Glass: Masterpieces from the Corning Museum.

Eva/Ave features 152 woodcuts, metalcuts, engravings and etchings on the theme "woman" in prints from the 15th thru the 17th centuries, including examples by such famous artists as Dürer, Rembrandt, Hans Burgkmair, Marcantonio Raimondi, and Lucas Cranach the Elder. The various works portray the widelyheld Medieval and Renaissance view that women had two conflicting natures: Good- as symbolized by the Virgin, and Evil- as symbolized by Eve. The exhibit is arranged in several major thematic sections: Heroines and Worthy Women, The Virgin and Saints, Eve. Venus, The Power of Women, Lovers, and Lovers with Death, and Fortune and Prudence.

Some highlights of the exhibit are:

- Dürer's famous engraving of Adam and Eve (1504).
- Burgkmair's "The Nine Female Worthies" (woodcut, 1519), from his "The Eighteen Worthies" series (which includes their attributed heraldic devices).
- -a beautifully detailed German interior scene featuring "Samson and Delilah" (engraving, 1545) Hans Brosamer.
- "Prudencia," from the famous series known as "The Tarocchi Cards of Mantegna" (1465).
- several very famous depictions of witches: Dürer's "Witch Riding on a Goat" (1501) and "The Four Witches" (1497), and Hans Grien's "Bewitched Groom" (1544).

The exhibit is located in the west end ground floor of the National Gallery of Art, and will run thru April 28.

#### Reviews Continued

The Art of Glass is a survey of the artistic history of glass, featuring 121 piecs from the Corning Glass Museum (the most comprehensive collection of glass artifacts in the world). The exhibitted pieces span 35 centuries of glasswork, featuring pieces from ancient Egypt, the Roman Empire, Renaissance Europe, Islamic and Asian cultures, and the modern world. Several of the pieces should be of interest to members of the SCA. Some of the more spectacular are:

- a magnificent enamelled "mosgue lamp" with gilt "heraldic cup" decorations from Syria (prob. Damascus, c. 1335).
- several familiar-looking German drinking glasses (blown, with applied decorations) that could have served as the models for any number of Dutch still-life paintings.
- a mottled drinking horn (blown and lustered), probably from Egypt (9th-11th century).
- a magnificent foot-high "Imperial drinking horn" (blown, with enamelled and gilt decorations) from Bohemia (1574); which features a huge Imperial eagle, wings displayed and decorations with dozens ans dozens of heraldic shields for the various cities, counties, kingdoms, etc. of the Holy Roman Empire. [My personal favorite!]

"The Art of Glass" is in the East Building of the National Gallery of Art, and will continue thru March 17.

# NOTES FROM THE JANUARY BARONY MEETING

The January Barony meeting was held at the home of Lord Herverus d'Ormonde on Jan. 13,1991.

OFFICER'S REPORTS: Herald: Master Conrad reported that the transfer of office from Lord Donal to him was complete, that all files had been received and the end of year report had been filed. Marshal: Lord Stefan, reporting for Lord Cosimo, relayed the progress in the search for a Monday practice site. Lists: no report. Arts & Sciences: no report. Exchequer: Lady Aislinn reported that the preparation for the 1990 taxes continued and that she would be going over the books with her predecessor Lady Maura, the next weekend. She mentioned the possibility of changing the bank account from Virginia to Maryland or the District, and possibly opening a separate account for the Drekkar. She also announced that she is seeking a Deputy and would like all interested parties to contact her. The account balance for the Barony was announced at \$2973.86, with \$327.63 attributed to the Drekkar. Chronicler: The new Chronicler, Wm. Conor MacLean, introduced himself and then asked his predecesor, Lord Beornheard, to give the year end report. He noted that there are currently 126 subscriptions, with 21 of them being complimentary ( sent to Kingdom officers, royalty, local groups) making a subscription liability of \$353.50 (figuring the old postage cost leading to a \$.50 @ issue total expense), or a \$454.20 liability (using the new higher postage rate leading to a \$.5833 @ issue cost). Based on these known future expenses, plus the upcoming cost of the Tintinnabulum (to be published in late Spring), Lord Conor requested and received a \$300.00 grant from the Barony to cover the years expenses. Possible cost overruns were discussed and Baronessa Ilaria offered to run a fund raiser for the Drekkar at the upcoming Barons Championship. Seneschal: The new Chatelaine, Eber Finn, is handing out Drekkars to new folk. He also worked with a photographer/reporter at 12th Night who is preparing a feature story on the SCA.

CANTON NOTES: Neapsbury Downs: has now officially changed their name from Osprey Fjord. Their 4th Quarter report was being completed at the time of the meeting. Ponte Nove: will be changing their name due to a mundane conflict. Their 4th quarter report has been submitted. They now have a new meeting site, see the announcement on page 22.
