

Northern Location: At the home of Lord Beornheard of Wearmouth, 3603 Oliver Street, Hyattsville, Maryland.

From the Capitol Beltway (I-495): Take New Hampshire Avenue South to Adelphi Road. Go left onto Adelphi. After several miles, you will come to Route 410 (East-West Highway). Get in the right-hand lane, and cross over 410 onto Queens Chapel Road. Go through the light at the top of the hill, and make the next right onto Oliver Street.

From The City: Take North Capitol Street to Michigan Avenue. (Look for the signs to Providence Hospital and the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception). Turn right onto Michigan. It will become Queens Chapel Rd when it leaves the District. Oliver street is approx. 5.4 miles from the intersection of North Capitol and Michigan. You will eventually pass through a shopping district (a shopping center, gas stations, a Pizza Hut, etc). Queens chapel road then goes up a very noticeable hill. Oliver street is on the other side of the hill, at the bottom, on the left. If you reach Route 410 (East-West Highway), you have gone too far. If so, cross 410, turn around, and follow the 'from the Capital Beltway' directions above.

From the City: Leaving the city on I-395, get onto U.S. 1 South. turn right on 23rd Street. Take a right onto Ives. When Ives meets 16th St., take a left onto 16th. It is a white house on the right.

From Northern Virginia: Driving toward the city on I-395, exit on U.S. 1 to Pentagon City. Stay to the right of the exit lanes and get onto Army Navy Drive. At the second light, take a left onto Joyce St. Take the first right to stay on Joyce, then take the first left after the road narrows. This will be 16th St. Look for the white house on the left.



Arts and Sciences Exhibit Order of the Pearl

The Order of the Pearl, in association with the University of Atlantia, is pleased to announce that there will be an exhibit of the Arts and Sciences to be held at the Summer Session of the University in Isenfir. It is the purpose of the Order to offer to all gentles the chance to display diverse aspects of the Arts and Sciences as they are practiced throughout the kingdom. This exhibit will be non-competitive; i.e. there will be no judging or prizes awarded. However, upon request, companions of the Order will be present to evaluate the works entered in the exhibit. These evaluations will be specifically geared towards providing guidance and constructive criticism.

The guidelines governing the exhibit are as follows:

- 1. Everyone, whatever their level of skill, is encouraged to display their work. Part of the purpose of this exhibit is to bring forward beginners and help them to make contact with others to the enrichment of everyone's knowledge.
- 2. Although display of recent work is encouraged, any item may be displayed. The display of an exceptionally fine artifact, such as a scroll or piece of furniture, which will serve to instruct and/or inspire others is welcome. The exhibitor need not be the creator of the entry, although if possible the creator's permission should be obtained.
- 3. Work in progress is acceptable provided it is sufficiently advanced; indeed, being able to see the steps involved in production is often fascinating.
- 4. Displays should optionally be accompanied by some form of description/explanation/documentation so that anyone viewing the display has some reference as to what the display is, how it was created, and its place in history. The documentation is to be displayed with the exhibit.

- 5. An area will be set aside for the performing arts. A schedule will be set up in 15 minute increments; this includes set up and take down time. At the discretion of the person in charge of the room, an exception of 30 minutes may be given to larger groups doing short theatrical presentations or dances. If there are unclaimed time slots, the person in charge may permit a performer to go overtime or have a second time period later. This time restriction will be enforced as a courtesy to all performers; any performance which runs overtime will be cut short.
- 6. If site regulations permit, we will allow displays of cooking and brewing. Cooked items are limited to cold and/or preserved foods. Brewed items must be non-alcoholic. If such displays are meant to be sampled, the exhibitor is required to provide disposable cups, plates, napkins, flatware, garbage bags, etc. The exhibitor must also be prepared to clean up potential messes from spillage and breakage. Please note: It is as yet uncertain whether the site will allow this type of display. An announcement will be in the Acorn at a later time; Lady Deirdre O'Siodhachain may also be contacted.
- 7. Exhibits of written entries will be permitted. This includes items such as poetry or research papers. It is suggested that exhibitors have sufficient copies so that anyone viewing the exhibit may take one copy to read the entry at their leisure.
- 8. Exhibitors must register their display(s) during a specified time slot (to be announced). No entry fees will be charged. Exhibitors needing large amounts of space or having special requirements must make contact Lady Deirdre O'Siodhachain in advance to determine if their needs can be accommodated.

Exhibitors will be required to pick up their displays promptly at the end of the day. No exceptions. Unclaimed items will be assumed to be unwanted.

9. When registering an exhibit, an exhibitor may optionally select to have a companion of the Pearl consult with them regarding the exhibit. A list of names and areas of expertise will be available when registering. The exhibitor may select a name, or have one assigned. The exhibitor may schedule more than one evaluation if so desired. The purpose of the critique is to provide helpful advice and guidance. The exhibit is not being judged, but evaluated according to the skill and knowledge of the creator.

Because this exhibit is being held in conjunction with the University of Atlantia, there may be scheduling conflicts with class times. Companions doing the evaluations will do their best to arrange a convenient time; please try to be flexible.

It is with great pleasure that the Order looks forward to this event. We hope to seem many of you there and have the opportunity to become better acquainted with the wealth of talent in the kingdom.


