





Ideas for newsletters—Event reports, A&S Articles, Articles from officers, artwork, cartoons, meeting minutes, persona histories, event flyers, activites, history of lives of people in the SCA medieval jeopardy, trivia... Also could have a picture in one issue, in the next have people submit what they think happened in the picture.

Be sure to do a credits section. Newsletters to be mailed by 25th of each month.

Dover clipart is available in limited amounts.

Be sure spine is down when addressing so that it goes through the machine better.

Baronies are the only group REQUIRED to have a chronicler.

If you have a suscription base "Be one with your exchecquer" be very detailed about expenses and income

We cannot do an electronic newsletter and then charge for hard copies; newsletter in its entirety cannot appear on the web if we charge for it. Electorinic distrubition is up to groups; can be email lists, web page etc. Restricted posting email lists are not considered an electronic newsletter. If it comes in pieces from multiple people it is not an electronic newsletter, if it comes in one piece from one person it is.

Quarterly reports are required by chroniclers. Examples and blank reports are in back of packet #1. Quarters are Jan-Mar, Apr-Jun etc.; reports due month after. They would prefer electronic copies. It does not have to be the form supplied but it has to have all the info on the the form

Corporate says that electronic mailing lists will NEVER be official as long as Rabba is in charge.

Local newsletters cannot accept advertisements but can have sponsored pages or issues. All content should be appropriate to the society. You are responsible for the content of the newsletter. If you don't want to print something don't print it. Be careful not to print things that would "enflame the populace"

Webminister stuff

There is a quiet plan to make the Kingdom Webminister it's own office, not deputy to chronicler. The only level where the webminister is a deputy is at the kingdom level – not society or local levels. (note: there was an email sent out later to say this is only in the works on all levels not current policy)

Unevent Notes (Continued)

Pages should have the official disclamer on them. We should time delay articles posted to the web to preserve the value of the hard copy. You should have permission to post before you put it up. These rules are all about staying out of court. Use publication permissions form off the kingdom web page.

Rule of thumb for pictures — if you can't recognize the faces you only need permission of the photographer; if you can recognize the faces, ask permission of subjects as well as photographer. This goes for Arms as well. If the arms are visible then you should get permission from the person in the picture.

Pay attention to the letters in the Acorn, they are there for a purpose.

Domain name—If we decide to register one we NEED to keep track of the renewal date. Example: Spiagia had one, missed renewal date; very messy results including an "adult" site aquiring the Domain. If we register a name in association with the website be sure to register the office not a specific person for example webminister or Exchequer not Orlaith or Ulric" to ensure continuity.

Currently there are no size restrictions on the kingdom web server. Scripting is not possible at the moment. ASP is not going to be possible ever.
