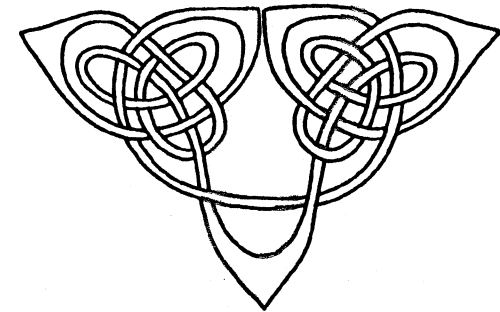
From the Capitol Beltway (I-495): Take New Hampshire Avenue South to Adelphi Road. Go left onto Adelphi. After several miles, you will come to Route 410 (East-West Highway). Get in the right-hand lane, and cross over 410 onto Queens Chapel Road. Go through the light at the top of the hill, and make the next right onto Oliver Street.

From The City: Take North Capitol Street to Michigan Avenue. (Look for the signs to Providence Hospital and the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception). Turn right onto Michigan. It will become Queens Chapel Rd when it leaves the District. Oliver street is approx. 5.4 miles from the intersection of North Capitol and Michigan. You will eventually pass through a shopping district (a shopping center, gas stations, a Pizza Hut, etc). Queens chapel road then goes up a very noticeable hill. Oliver street is on the other side of the hill, at the bottom, on the left. If you reach Route 410 (East-West Highway), you have gone too far. If so, cross 410, turn around, and follow the "from the Capital Beltway" directions above.

A Night on the Towne



The shire will be hosting "A Night on the Towne" on June 22, 1991. This will be an attempt at a period recreation of a single, admittedly rather busy, day and evening in a minor English port during the reign of Elizabeth I. Gentles are courteously requested to wear late period garb.

Participants will be issued a pouch of coins and an information packet. This packet could have almost anything in it, but the idea will be the same: integrate your persona into the town. You could be here to court a lady, avenge a friend, seek a husband, spy for the Spaniards, pay a gambling debt, or almost anything. Contact Henry Best in advance for special requests.

This is a rapier event and resolution of violent conflict will be by the rules of Atlantian Duello. We will have marshals stationed at key points as safety observers. Unarmed? It is always possible to hire brave swords as bodyguards or to help with some errand or another. The town watch is ever-vigilant and is here for your safety. Ladies: honor and courtesy are high ideals here; a simple scream should bring several gallants to your rescue.

As at our Village Faire last March, there will be an economy in place using the coins you have seen at Count Guido's Knave and Coin. Gentles are urged to bring what props they can and set up shoppe. Sunshades are recommended. Minstrels, beggars, peddlers, thieves, gamblers, shopkeepers or whatever you wish are all welcome. There will be prizes for the best death, swashbuckler, storefront, persona, most entertaining entrepreneur, noblest deed, and other similar categories.

There will be a pot-luck feast in the evening. Gentles are asked to bring their own (small) main course plus a dish to pass (either dinner or dessert) that will feed 5-8 people for the buffet table. Beverages and bread will be happily provided.

The site is Coyner Springs, a secluded park in Waynesboro, VA and is, regrettably, dry. Set-up starts at 7 am and Troll at 11 am. We will adjourn to the after-revel site at 9:30 pm. Crash and tent space available.

Kingdom of Atlantia June 27-30

The 1991 Known World Heraldic and Scribal Symposium will be held in the Barony of Storvik. Note: the site is in the Barony of Lochmere, and the Autocrat wishes to thank that Barony for their kindness in permitting her to use their territory for this event, and for all their help with the event. In addition to the College of Arms meeting, classes on heraldic and scribal topics, tours of local sights and opportunities to socialize with fellow heralds and scribes are planned.

We welcome any participants who wish to arrive early (or stay late), but the activities of the Symposium begin with a small gathering on Thursday at the hotel.

During the day Friday, tours will be available to the Smithsonian museums, The National Gallery of Art, the Library of Congress, National Archives, Walters Art Gallery, Textile Museum, G-Street Fabrics and the historical monuments of the nation's capital. Please indicate which, if any, tours (as well as other sights) are of interest on your registration request.

Friday classes may also be offered, if there is sufficient interest. Friday evening, a formal reception will open the official Symposium activities.

On Saturday, a variety of classes and workshops will be offered. Our special guest speaker is Dr. Gerald Brault: Professor at Pennsylvania State University and author of Early Blazon. Onomastics (names and naming practices) classes will be taught by Mistress Ælfwynn Grythsdottir (former Lady Vesper), Baron Dathi Thorfinnson (Lord Ægis), Geirr Bassi Haroldson (author of The Old Norse Name), Mistress Keridwen ferch Morgan Glasfryn (Lady Harpy) and Lord Talan Gwynek (Lord Dragon). Master Bruce Draconarius (Lord Batonvert) and Master Da'ud ibn Auda (al'Jamal Herald Extraordinary) will offer classes on heraldry. Classes on various aspects of the scribal arts will also be offered.

From the Beltway take I-295 (Baltimore/Washington Parkway) north from DC. Exit at Route 198 West. The Holiday Inn is on the right in about 2 or 3 blocks.

The site is St.Martin's In the Fields Episcopal Church in Severna Park, MD. Take Route 198 East from the hotel to Route 32 East. Take this to Route 175 East, and this to 32 East again (no, this is not a typo). Take 32 East to Routes 3/97 North. **WARNING!** There is much construction in this area, watch the signs carefully. Novice and Unbelted Fighters

Tourney

The Barony of Storvik is proud to host the 11th annual tournament for novice and unbelted fighters on Saturday, July 13, 1991 at New Hampshire Estates Elementary School in Takoma Park, MD. There will be both heavy weapons and duello tourneys.

Heavy Weapons Tourney: Two lists will be run, one for novice fighters (those fighters who have been authorized to fight in the lists for less than one year), and one for all other unbelted fighters. Fighters can participate in only one heavy list. Prizes will be awarded in both lists for most chivalrous fighter, winner of the tournament, and best death. **This year we will depart from the traditional double elimination tourney. Instead, both lists will be round robin and each fighter will have at least 4 fights.**

Duello Tourney: The structure and format of the rapier tourney will be determined at the event. Prizes will be awarded for the winner of the tournament and best death in all lists.

All fighters (both heavy and duello) should remember to bring their fighter's authorization cards and to check their expiration date to ensure their validity. Fighters who need to authorize are reminded that Pennsic is rapidly approaching, and this would be a good time to do so.

In compliance with the SCA's waiver policy, all attendees must show their SCA membership cards or sign a general site waiver when they check in at the site.

There is almost no shade at this site, so please bring your pavillions, canopies, sunhats and sunscreen. Cold drinks will be provided throughout the day. In case of rain, the tourneys will be held in the gym. School policy dictates that black-soled shoes or boots cannot be worn in the gym. All fighters should bring non-

blacksoled shoes in case the fighting is moved indoors. Please note that there are no showers or locker rooms available, and the hall is not air conditioned. There is no feast, and the site must be completely vacated by 9 pm. Merchants are requested to contact the autocrat in advance.

Important note: no live steel is allowed on the site and the site is **EXTREMELY** dry.

A children's Arts and Sciences display will be held in the all-purpose room from 2pm to 5pm. The display is open to children 13 and younger, and anything with a medieval theme can be exhibited. A description of the item should be included on an index card, along with the displayer's name and age. Please bring any items for the display to the exhibit tables in the all-purpose room between 1:15 and 2pm, and pick them up after the display closes at 5pm.

A garb exchange will be held in the all-purpose room from 2-5pm. While the emphasis for the exchange is on children's garb, adult garb can also be exchanged. Gentles bringing garb for the exchange should attach an index card to each item that lists their name, the size of the outfit (or age of child it was made for), and whether the outfit is being given away free or sold. Culinary Corner

This month's recipe is from Scotland. The translation we are using is from a chronicle of the MacLean clan history (**A History of the Clan MacLean**, J.P.MacLean, Robert Clarke & Co.: 1889). According to the chronicle, the recipe is from original papers from the chieftainship of Hector Odhar, the ninth chief of the clan MacLean, who fought and died alongside the King of Scotland in 1513 (King James IV) at Flodden Field.

The chronicle comments that the recipe was translated from Gaelic, but did not give the original Gaelic form. In other words, from a scholarly point of view, the veracity of the translation could then be questioned. But, since it has been kitchen tested and the results were *wunderbar* (that's "wonderful" for all you non-germanic speaking peoples), we believe it to be reasonably true.

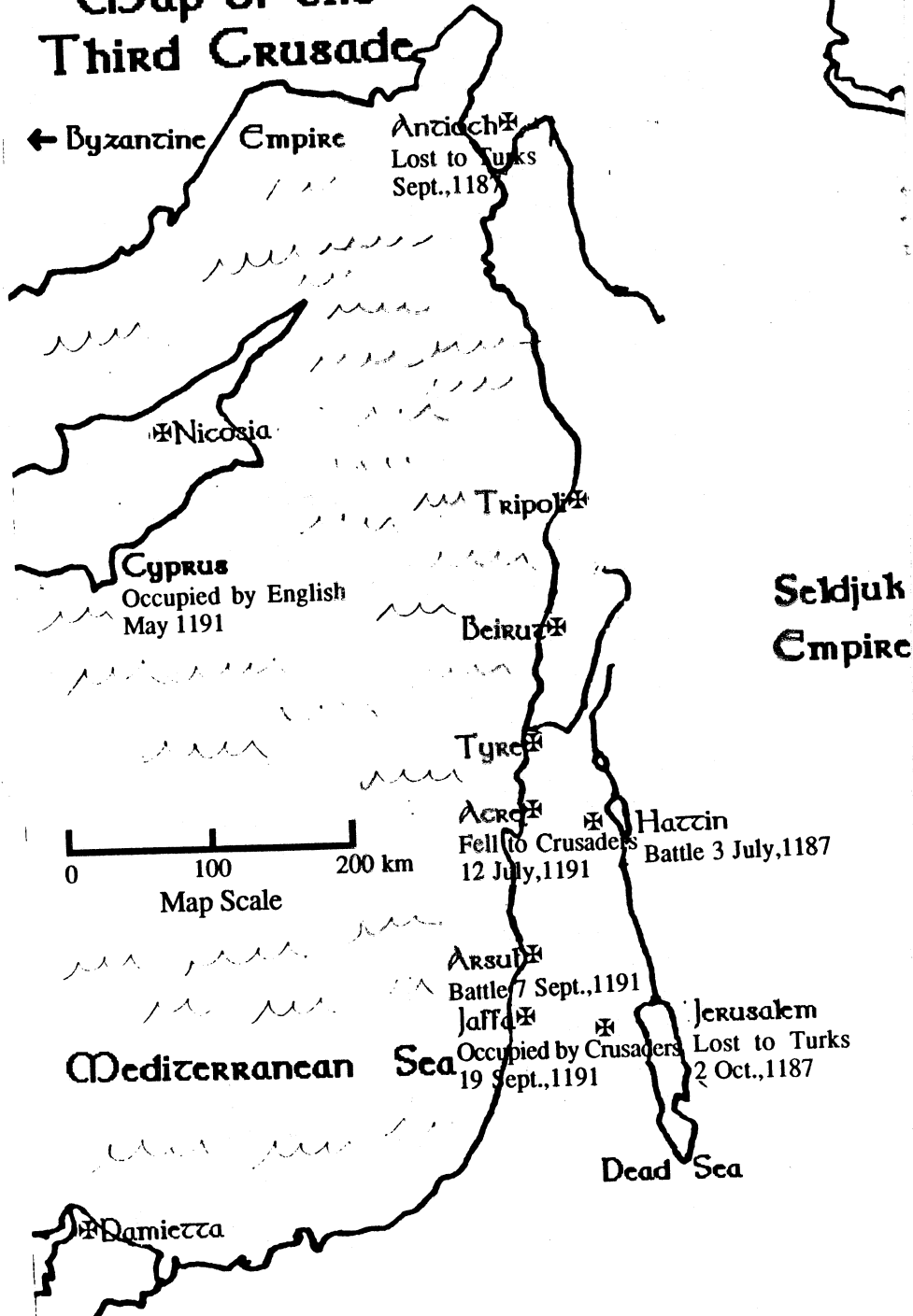
BEEF SAUSAGE

2 lbs. ground beef
1 tsp thyme
1 tsp marjoram (this is questionable, since it was not available in England until the late 16th century)
1 tsp sage
2 bay leaves
1/2 tsp coriander
2 tsp ground pepper
pinch of salt
1/2 tsp summer savory
1/8 tsp nutmeg

Pulverize spices, then mix with ground beef. Cook as desired. Note - this makes dandy Scotch Eggs, which just happens to be next month's recipe.

The Third Crusade

PART III

by Wm. CONOR MacLean

Since you expressed a wish to be further informed concerning the state of our own personage and the progress of the glorious army of the life-giving cross, it seems worth reporting first that as soon as we reached the borders of the empire of our brother emperor of Constantinople, Isaac II Angelus, we sustained no little loss in the plundering of our property and the massacre of our men, a loss reckoned to have been clearly instigated by the emperor himself. - from a letter from Frederick to his son Henry.

Constantly harassed by the Byzantines, the German army made very slow progress through November of 1189. At one point in his letter to his son, Frederick is so frustrated by the attacks, that he asks his son to contact envoys in the Italian states to bring their armies to Constantinople to meet with the Germans in March of 1190 to put the city to siege. After meeting with the Byzantine chancellor - John Ducas - in early January of 1190, Frederick agreed to set aside his plans of the siege of Constantinople if the Byzantines would allow free unimpeded travel of the army through their territories and replacement of the provisions and horses they had lost thusfar.

While the Germans were struggling to get through Byzantium, and the English and French were still feuding, the king of Jerusalem - Guy of Lusignan, who had been the commander of the Christian forces in the disastrous battle at Hattin - was re-gathering his army at Tyre, along with the help of the army of Conrad of Montferrat. In August of 1189, their army approached Acre and put it to siege.

Third Crusade Continued...

Saladin sent a medium sized force to relieve the city, but after several skirmishes a stalemate was reached and both sides settled in for what was to be a long siege.

Frederick and his army continued their march east thru the Taurus Mountains, in which is today called southern Turkey. In June of 1190, a terrible tragedy struck the Germans, as recounted in the *Historia de Expeditione Frederici*:

At this time the whole army of the Holy Cross, both rich and poor, both sick and those who seemed well, were still equally struggling with the heat of the sun and the warmth of the season, on a difficult route over boulderstrewn rocks ... Frederick Barbarossa, utterly unswayed by any danger, wanted to avoid the mountain tops and temper the excessive heat, and so he attempted to swim across the fast flowing river Goksu, although everyone tried to stop him. He entered the water and plunged into the stream. Then he, who had often escaped massive dangers, wretchedly perished. When the other nobles rushed to him, they were too late to give help and could only pull him out and bring him at last to shore.

Thus ended the life of the great German emperor. Without his leadership and drive, the German army dispersed. Many returned to Germany, some settled in Byzantium, and some chose to follow their great leader and ended their lives. Less than a thousand of Frederick's massive army continued on to the holy lands, reaching their goal in early 1191.

Within a month of Frederick's death, Philip and Richard had finally settled their differences and set sail for the holy lands on

4 July 1190. Arriving in Messina in Sicily in September, in what was intended to be nothing more than a re-supply stop, Richard quickly took the opportunity to settle an old family dispute with the ruler of Sicily, Tancred of Lecce. Using his crusader army, Richard attacked and sacked Messina on the morning of 4 October 1190. Philip was outraged, and angry words were exchanged between the two monarchs. If not for the cooler heads of their chancellors, there surely would have been another war.

After wintering in Messina, Philip's army sailed for the holy lands on 29 March, followed by Richard and his army on 10 April 1191. One of the ships in Richard's fleet, the one containing his bride-to-be Berengaria of Navarre, was separated from the main body of ships during a storm and ran aground in Limassol on the island of Cyprus. Richard diverted his fleet to Cyprus to pick up Berengaria and her retainers, but upon landing was attacked by the forces of Isaac Comnenus, the ruler of Cyprus. Richard responded violently as related by the archivist Ralph of Diceto (d.1201) in his *Images of History* (written c.1180 to 1201):

...Isaac Ducas Comnenus, lord of that country, went with a strong force to contest the King of England's landing, and did much damage to the King's men, plundering those who were shipwrecked and shutting them up in prison to die of hunger. King Richard was enraged and hastened to avenge such injuries, fighting the enemy and winning a quick victory. He kept the conquered man in chains... and subjugating the whole island of Cyprus with all its castles. Comnenus struck a bargain with the King not to be kept in irons. This was duly observed: the King had silver chains made for him, and had him imprisoned in a castle near Tripoli...

Meanwhile Guy of Lusignan and his army were waiting outside of Acre for help to come, as Diceto chronicled from a letter he acquired, that was written in early March 1191:

To the venerable lord and father in Christ Richard bishop of London, Hubert by the same grace bishop of Salisbury, greetings in continuing and devoted friendship.

The city of Acre is strongly resisting our attacks, and we cannot capture it because it is well supplied with men, defences and engines of war; and Saladin on the other side of us has surrounded us. The Christians hope to be able to bear the burdens and distresses of the siege until our kings arrive. That is, if they come around Easter. If they delay longer we will not be able to afford to continue, and our hope of early consolation will vanish. This is how it is with the siege of Acre.

Easter came and went for the crusaders besieging Acre, with still no word from the armies of Richard and Philip. Still the siege continued.

This concludes part III of the Chronicle of the Third Crusade.



SALADIN THE HONOURABLE ENEMY

Born in 1138 in what is today Iraq, he entered the service of the Zangid Sultan Nur ad-Din in approximately 1155, and accompanied him and his uncle on two campaigns to Egypt between 1164 and 1168. Quickly gaining a reputation for military prowess and strategy, he rose rapidly through the ranks of the sultan's army to be named general over the conquered Fatimid Egyptians in 1169.

When Nur ad-Din died in 1174, Saladin (always the ambitious) married his widow and carefully assumed Nur ad-Din's mantle of leadership and began to consolidate his territories. The reason for his caution was that he was not the successor to Nur ad-Din, al-Malik al-Salih (Nur's son) was. It was not until al-Malik's accidental death in 1181 that Saladin became the absolute ruler of the Muslim lands, forming the Ayyubid Sultanate.

Between 1175 and 1185, Saladin retained generally peaceful relations between the Muslims and Crusader states, but continued to build his army and navy. The peace ended in May of 1187 when an armed group of Christians attacked and destroyed a Muslim pilgrim caravan. Saladin's response was to invade the crusader states, and on 4 July 1187 he defeated the Crusaders at the battle of Hattin. On 2 Oct, after capturing the major coastal towns, except for Tyre, he made a triumphant entry into Jerusalem.

He lost Acre back to the crusaders in 1191, and signed a truce with King Richard of England in September of 1192. Saladin died six months later, and within a few years the unity of his great empire was shattered by the squabbling among his brothers and sons.

Saladin continued...

Although fired by personal and family ambition, Saladin was also a man of great piety and religious fervor. He was the first Muslim ruler to use the concept of holy war, *jihad*, to unite his people and to infuse them with a common religious ideal. Both friends and enemies considered Saladin an honourable man in a dishonourable time. Even in crusader chronicles, during the bitterest defeats of the Christians, they praised his honor, fairness, nobility and mercy.

The Tears of Saladin

Once during the siege, when I was riding at the sultan's side against the Franks, an army scout came to us with a sobbing woman beating her breast. 'She came from the Frankish garrison,' the scout explained, 'and wants to see the master. We brought her here.' Saladin asked his interpreter to question her. She said: 'Yesterday some Muslim thieves entered my tent and stole my little girl. I cried all night, and our commanders told me: the king of the Muslims is merciful; we will let you go to him and you can ask for your daughter back. Thus have I come, and I place all my hopes in you.' Saladin was touched, and tears came to his eyes. He sent someone to the slave market to look for the girl, and less than an hour later a horseman arrived bearing the child on his shoulders. As soon as she saw them, the girl's mother threw herself to the ground and smeared her face with sand. All those present wept with emotion... Thus was her daughter returned to her, and she was escorted back to the camp of the Franks.
