

minutes of the storvik baronial meeting 14 May 1995 at the home of Baron Corun

Reports: Seneschal: The Trimesterly Report is out and available. She received a letter from the Clerk Signet offering teaching services. She also received a letter from St. Andrew's accepting our apology. Exchequer: Tehair has agreed to be the new Exchequer. Dolphin will be the Deputy. We will receive \$19\80 for the Border's Demo. Quarterly reports went out & were accepted. There is currently \$824.70 in Storvik's account. MOL: Isabella send Johanna a list of the Atlantian fighters so that she could check to be sure that all the Storviki fighters are on the list. MOL office is still open. Stefan is acting for now and is currently the only warranted MOL in Storvik. Archery: Johanna got new forms from Kingdom for the Archer Marshal. Gold Key: Willnow be known as Silver Key. Got a rack for the Garb closet and will now house the loaner garb. Marshal: Storvik now has 2 fighter practices. One on Mondays at Denis' and one on Thursdays at Lady Aisha's. The Marshal is ISO deputies. Demo: The Border's demo did not go as well as hoped...there were 3 other events in the area that same day. However, it did attract a couple of new fighters. Baron Niall has requested help with an event June 10-11 at a County Fair in Ponte Alto. There will be a Living History section with a space for the SCA. Chronicler: 2 renewals, 1 new 10-year subscription. We are now using a new copy service "Copies Now" which has much lower prices, yet gives the quality to which we are accustomed. Seeking more original articles for the Drekkar. A&S: Low attendance at Dance Night may cause cancellation. Rapier Marshal: NTR. Herald: Still looking for a new Herald. Two interested people are currently being considered. Wrattingham: Sam Hunt will be their Marshal. Monthly Canton meetings will now also be workshops...bring projects.

Old Business: Brenna purchased the materials for the Queen's favours and will work on them at Garb Wars.

Jaelle reported that the SCA helped sell about \$1,700 worth of books of which, Storvik and Ponte Alto will receive 15%. Each Barony will also receive 5 \$20 gift certificates. Tehair reported that help is needed for the JFK High School Medieval Faire demo on Sat. and Sun., May 20-21. She is also seeking copies of SCA event photos to use at demos.

New Business: Johanna, Brema and Jaelle attended Curia. One point of discussion was the possible changes to the Kingdom Arms. (Contact Jaelle for specifics.) Also discussed were the Great Officer and Royal Stipends (\$75 per reign to help offset costs of travel, etc.). They will be standardizing the terms of Barons and Baronesses to 4 years (Storvik currently has that term limit in place). The Red Tape will be published soon in Notebook format. Payto-fight is back in place in Atlantia. Atlantia is having money problems and King Michael is seeking ideas for raising the extra needed funds. More regalia is needed. Brenna committed to making new kneeling pads once arms are settled. The Pre-Pennsic Handbook lists that all campers must be out by noon on Sunday, Aug. 20. This is wrong--the correct time is sundown. Any Storvikian who would like to camp with Clan Cambion should contact Brenna ASAP. Tehair has volunteered to host Newcomer meetings as of July, but may change to the 4th Friday. She proposed a 'traveling' meeting that changes sites eachmonth.

Events: There will be a Celtic Festival at Oatlands Plantation in VA June 17-18. If anyone wants more information, Catriona has a flier. (Cindy Stanford, 301-474-8642.) July 7-9, Baron's Champ/Novice Tourney at Croom. We have sites A,B and D at Croom. Each site has a fire ring and a couple of picnic tables. It will be \$1 per night per person for camping in addition to the site fee. Post-Pennsic Revel, August 26. St. Andrew's has agreed to provide the site for \$125 plus a \$50 deposit. The site is also available if we wish to host a University for \$300. Brewer's Exposition in Oct. or Nov. Stefan of Cambion had expressed an interest in doing this again. May combine it with the Archery and War Collegium. Yule Revel on Dec. 30. Caitilin and Stephan are autocratting. Igor has consented to be Father Christmas and distribute gifts to the children. Performer's Revel is still on hold for January. A Valentine's Day Event may be done.

Highland Foorde 9-11 June 1995

Come for the shooting, the fighting, the arts. Come to spend the night, or just come to enjoy.

The Shire of Highland Foorde invites you to our annual bone-crushing brain-scrambling, hide-tanning overnight bash.

There will be melee fighting and lists. Authorizations will begin at 10am, list to begin at 11. We will have a single elimination tourney for the demonstration part of the day (morning), and then melee in the afternoon. What type of melee we have depends on how many fighters.

There will be target archery! On one range, there will be royal rounds run, interchanged with slot and advancing soldier targets recognizable as SCA fighters, such as Duke, Sir Michael of Bedford. On a separate range, Master McDougalls of Rivendale (East Kingdom) will be teaching, with loaner equipment available. Master McDougalls received his peerage for archery, and can probably teach most everyone something.

The Arts and Sciences EXHIBITS will include needlework, illumination, dance or whatever else for which we have volunteers. Those willing to be exhibitionists, please contact the autocrat for coordination.

Last year, there was a Middle Eastern dance exhibit following dinner (both male and female). We will continue this popular feature this year.

There will be activities for children. There is playground equipment nearby. Merchants are encouraged. There is plenty of room for tents and tables. There will be a scrumptious feast, followed by a Bardic Circle well into the night.

The site is dry by day, discreetly wet by night.

Activities will include field, town and woods battles; target archery; duello; and an A&S exhibition. Provisions have been made for equestrian participation, though those wishing to participate in such activities must pre-register. Supervised nipper activities are planned.

The site is Lums Pond State Park in Bear, DE. The site has extensive horse and hiking trails as well as a large lake with swimming privileges and boat rentals. COLD showers are available. The site is wet, but no "modern" kegs or "party balls" are permitted.

This year, there will be a limited feast (100) and a dayboard. If you have special food requirements (e.g. allergies), please send them with your reservation.

The estate auction of the late, but ever so great, Leif the Lucky will be held after the feast. According to his Last Will and Testament, the proceeds will be donated to the Kingdom fundraiser. Directions: Take your best route to I-95. Take Delaware exit 1A (896 south, Middletown). Proceed south looking for signs marking the main entrance to the park.

Archers bring your bows. There will be a target shoot.

This is a camping event and there are port-a-johns and water on the site, a short walk from the camping area. The site closes at 8:00pm, but the autocrat will have a key. The troll will be at the gate with the key until 12 midnight on Friday for late arrivals. Troll will NOT be open past park closing on Saturday.

Fees: The site fee is \$4 for the weekend with a \$1 discount for paid Markland members. Smalls under 12 are free. Families pay a maximum of \$12. There will not be a feast. Come to the fair Barony of Ponte Alto, pick a side, and join in the fun as squires, freescholars, and other unbelted fighters stage a revolt, um...demonstrate their skills (yeah, that's it!) against the Knights of the Realm and the Members of the Academy d'Espe.

The forms for the rebellion um, demonstrations will be "a Castle gate battle, a tag-team melee, and a regular team melee for the Heavy fighters; team melees and a challenge tourney for the duellists; and archery for all. Further info. on the battles is available from the autocrat.

For the non-combat inclined, there will be a brewing competition, a games room, and a bardic competition. In keeping with the "Spring" theme, the brewing competition will have the following categories: Beers and ales, meads, quick mead, small ales, and short wines (where quick, short, or small implies less than 1 month to brew). The bardic competition will be for all bardic arts, for single as well as group performers, and will focus on period works. Judging criteria will include whether the piece is pre-1600, documentation of sources, period presentation (e.g. instrument/language), and performance quality. The theme of the A&S Display will be "works in progress." Show the Known World (or at least the part of it attending Spring's End) the wonderful and different things you're working on. This not only means physical products, but can also include ongoing research, and/or requests for sources/information on topics. Comment cards will be available for viewers to contribute information or make comments on the items on display.

The day's activities will be followed by a sumptuous feast prepared by Lady Winifred Corbet de Wynterwood. The feast will be served in one remove, and will include a selection of cold, roasted meats with sauces, savory pies, fruits, vegetables, breads, cheeses, and dessert (if you still have room!). After the feast, the hall will be cleared for dancing.

the moral of our tale: the function of allegory

The literature and pictorial arts of the Middle Ages and Renaissance were almost entirely didactic in nature. That is, they were made with the intent to educate their audience in some manner. Plays, poetry, treatises, pageants, sculpture, and painting were all meant to convey a message. Chivalric literature almost always had an introduction which indicated the desire to perpetuate the lives and deeds of the great exemplars of chivalry, both real and fictional. Many plays had a prologue to indicate the direction of the action and introduce the themes about to be presented. The authors of treatises rarely failed to explain why and for whom the piece was being written. Poetry was meant to convey societal norms via elevated sentiments and structured presentation. Church sculpture depicted the lives of the saints and stories from the bible. Portraiture was meant to display wealth and social position, as well as personal interests and traits. The production of any art was sufficiently expensive and burdensome that it was rarely wasted on entirely frivolous projects. Whether serious or light in subject matter, the arts were meant to inform and preserve their subject matter.

One of the tools commonly used to accomplish this was allegory. The term allegory was derived from the Latin allegoria, literally meaning to speak otherwise than one seems to speak (Oxford English Dictionary, p. 333). However, this does not quite reflect common usage. The purpose of allegory is to reveal the essence of what is being portrayed. In literature, an allegory is defined as "anarrative in which the agent and action, and sometimes the setting as well, are contrived both to make coherent sense on the 'literal,' or primary level of signification, and also to signify a second, correlated order of agents, concepts, and events." (Abrams, p. 4).

To put it a little more concretely, an allegory is a story told through the juxtaposition of characters whose names are things like Everyman, Idleness, Vainglory, or Pleasure. How each character is described and behaves is supposed to personify the thing for which it is named. If a character was called Idleness, she was beautiful, carried a mirror, was deeply involved in her personal grooming, and demanded the adulation of the other characters. Her counterpart might be Diligence, who would have been beautiful, compassionate, plainly dressed, and extolled the rewards of virtue and exposed the pitfalls of worldliness. Whatever the story line, Idleness would eventually have been punished for her vice, and Diligence would have been elevated in some fashion.

The use of allegory was reserved for literate society, and in the Middle Ages this meant the nobility and clerks. Because an allegory was (and is) something an artist created by selecting the conflict the characters were to play out, it was necessary to explain, at least initially, the theme to its audience. The morality play *Everyman* opens with the words, "Here Beginneth a Treatise How the High Father of Heaven Sendeth Death to Summon Every Creature to Come and Give Account of Their Lives in this World, and is in Manner of a Moral Play." (Norton Anthology, p.367-368) This neatly sets the stage for the action to follow and provides vital clues as to the nature of the characters. Simply to step into the play without introduction would render it obscure to its audience.

The first great allegory, the *Psychomachia* (*Battle of Souls*) of Prudentius, written in the 5th century ad, is the most classic of themes; the seven deadly sins in battle with the seven great virtues. This would act as a model from which most later allegories would develop. Notable examples are anonymous *The Vision of Piers Plowman*, de Lorris and Meun's *Romance of the Rose*, and Christine de Pisan's *City of Ladies*.

Most allegories begin with the author falling asleep or into a deep reverie; *The Romance of the Rose* conforms to this type. Or sometimes a communal vision is experienced, like the arrival of a Goddess at the culmination of a great gathering to announce a tournament or the founding of a chivalric order as in Christine de Pisan's *Dit de la Rose (Tale of the Rose)*. Allegory recognizes that it is not presenting an everyday experience and is not meant to be realistic in time and/or space; there is something magical or dreamlike about the highly symbolic scene and action about to take place. The audience is openly invited to suspend credulity and receive the deeper meaning unfolding in the presentation.

When the story passes from the the dream into action, a guide makes himself known to lead, instruct, and interpret for the dreamer. In the Romance of the Rose, the Lover (who is the dreamer) finds himself outside a garden and gains entrance through the good offices of Idleness. This lovely lady should immediately excite the Lover's suspicion for, as noted above, she carries a mirror and is excessively concerned with her personal grooming. But the Lover is lulled by the beauty and courtliness of the company to which she leads him. And thus it is in most allegories, a central guiding figure keeps the dreamer or visionary on courseand gives the audiencea focal point. Whether it is to arouse their sympathy or incite their hatred, the characters are generally clearly drawn with little need for delicate interpretation.

The conflict of the allegory plays out to its inevitable end. Good will always triumph over evil if the dreamer obeys the rules, but if not, failure lays in wait. The Lover in the Romance of the Rose (at least the initial section by de Lorris) loses his access to the Rose, the thing he loves most in the world, because he arouses the ire of Jealousy. However, in Everyman, the hero dies and receives God's grace for the sake of Good Deeds, who can help him achieve redemption.

Often the use of allegory can seem artificial and obvious. Indeed, many examples of poor or even downright silly allegory existed in period, penned by indifferent writers misusing a sophisticated technique. But when well used, it conveyed considerable insight into character and motivation. Even when allegory did not reveal any new information, it did serve to affirm and reinforce societal beliefs. The visible demonstration of the ugliness of sin in struggle against the beauty of virtue helped identify the positive values for society and encouraged rejection of the negative.
