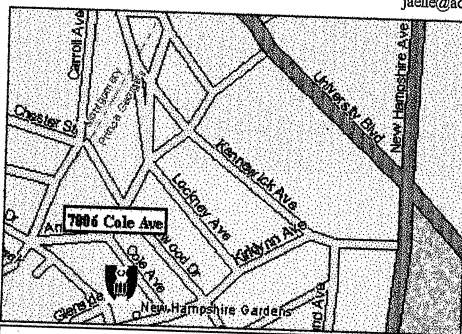

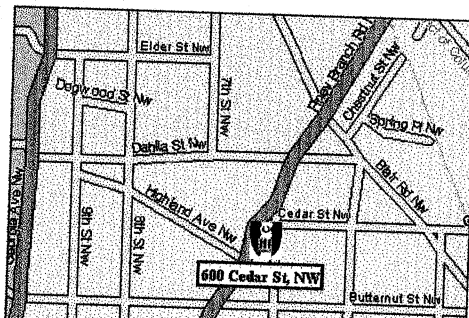

**Officer Reports—**

- Baron & Baroness** - The At-Home in June might happen without the good Baroness.

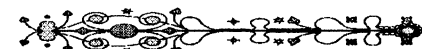
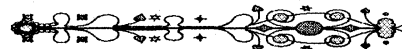

What's a birthday party without a good fight? Fighting is being overseen by Lord Oswulf the Grey. Novice fighters will have an opportunity to authorize. Multiple lists will be run, including the Novice List. Novice & championships lists will be Saturday & will include heavy weapons, light weapons, and archery.

There will be competitions in Bardic Arts and Arts & Sciences, as well as an open A&S display. The A&S competition will be Storvik-Themed Birthday Gifts—please enter an item to be donated afterwards to the Baronial gift coffer. 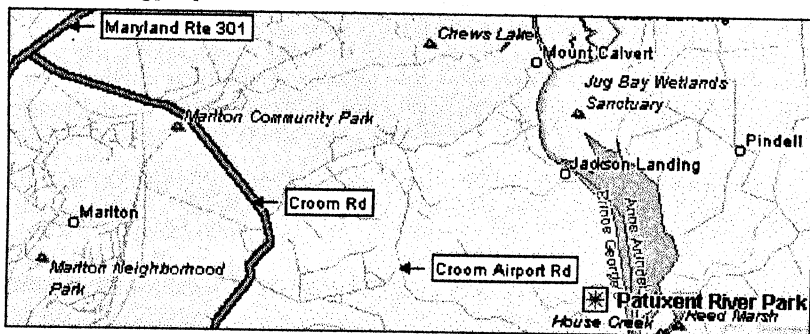
Alcohol on site is restricted to beer in kegs; we plan to make Good Beer freely available to those with proof of age at the Lusty Wench & Lucky Knave Tavern, brought to you by Tavernkeeper Mym the Minx and the wench and knaves of House Drunken Badger. 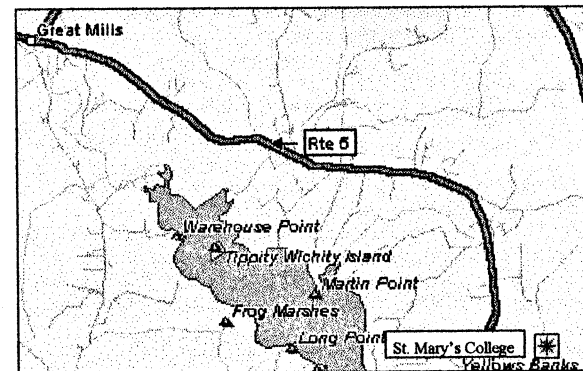
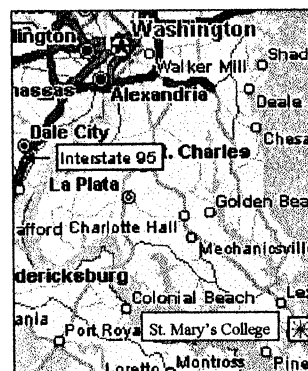

About 20 miles south of Waldorf, Route 5 branches to the right toward Leonardtown, and the main four-lane road continues straight and becomes Route 235. Continue on Route 235 to Lexington Park. Just past the Days Inn is a stoplight at Shangri-La Drive; a Master Donut is on the corner. Turn right onto Shangri-La Drive and follow it straight through the next stoplight (intersection of Great Mills Rd.); bear left at the fork in the road by the church. Proceed four miles to Route 5 (which will be the first stop sign). Turn left (south) on Route 5 and continue four miles to the College. You will know you are on the College campus when you see the beautiful St. Mary's River on your right.

## Special Exhibition (Through August 9): A Collector's Cabinet

Dutch and Flemish artists excelled in creating exquisite, small paintings. 17th Century patrons of the arts were not primarily princes or church leaders, but private citizens who had prospered from business and international trade. Because their residences were modest in comparison to palaces and churches, these collectors offered artists few opportunities for grand, decorative commissions. Instead, they preferred works of art that were appropriately sized for a "collector's cabinet" or *kunstkamer*. This term originally designated a kind of furniture for housing small & precious objects, but eventually referred to an intimately scaled room for displaying a private collection.

This exhibition will create the character of a 17th Century collector's cabinet, with an assembly of artistic and natural objects. Galleries will be hung with Dutch, Flemish, Italian, & German paintings. Four display cases will be devoted to other types of objects found in *kunstkamers*, such as small bronze, ivory, and wood sculptures; Dutch and Flemish commemorative medals; antique coins and medallions; rare Chinese and European decorative arts; jewelry; glass; musical and scientific instruments; and prints, drawings, and rare books. There will also be exotic shells and coral of the type brought back by Dutch traders from the South Pacific and the West Indies.

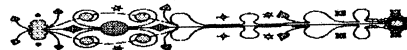
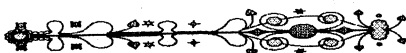
