




From the Capitol Beltway (I-495): Take New Hampshire Avenue South to Adelphi Road. Go left onto Adelphi. After several miles, you will come to Route 410 (East-West Highway). Get in the right-hand lane, and cross over 410 onto Queens Chapel Road. Go through the light at the top of the hill, and make the next right onto Oliver Street.

From The City: Take North Capitol Street to Michigan Avenue. (Look for the signs to Providence Hospital and the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception). Turn right onto Michigan. It will become Queens Chapel Rd when it leaves the District. Oliver street is aprox, 5.4 miles from the intersection of North Capitol and Michigan. You will eventually pass through a shopping district (a shopping center, gas stations, a Pizza Hut, etc). Queens chapel road then goes up a very noticeable hill. Oliver street is on the other side of the hill, at the bottom, on the left. If you reach Route 410 (Easton the other side of the hill, at the bottom, on the left. If you reach Route 410 (West Highway), you have gone too far. If so, cross 410, turn around, and follow the "from the Capital Beltway" directions above.

Directions: From the East Take I-270 to US-15 North. Take 15 to US-340 West. Exit at MD-17 Brunswick-Burkittsville. At the top of the exit ramp, turn left, and proceed one mile on Route 17 to the first full traffic light (a Sheetz gas station and a church will be on the right). Follow MD Route 17 into Brunswick (please note that at this point Route 17 hangs a right and may be under construction) for another mile until you find a yellow flasher. Make a left turn at the flasher and then an immediate right onto Maryland Ave. Go to the stop sign, turn right and go three blocks. The Brunswick Fire Hall is on the right side of the road and the parking lot is on the left.

From the South: Take your best route to Leesburg, VA and Route 7 West. Follow Route 7 to VA-9 West. Heraldic and Scribal Symposium 1991 Kingdom of Atlantia June 27-30

The 1991 Known World Heraldic and Scribal Symposium will be sponsored by the Barony of Storvik, in the Kingdom of Atlantia. Diverse activities for both beginning, intermediate and advanced heralds and scribes will be offered.

Scheduling: Thursday night there will be a small party/reception for people who are already on site. On Friday during the day there will be tours of DC and a formal reception at night. If there is sufficient interest, classes will be held on Friday. On Saturday the classes will be divided as: two tracks of scribal, one track of onomastics (names and naming practices), one track of advanced heraldry, and one track of basic heraldry. Saturday evening we will go off site for a feast and revel. There will be parties in the hotel when we return. Sunday will be the Laurel meeting and more classes.

Speakers: Dr. Gerald Brault, author of Early Blazon, has agreed to come and speak. Dr. Jeri Fleck (Geirr Bassi Haroldsson) will speak on Norse Onomastics. Mistress Aelfwyn Grythdottir has agreed to teach a class on Anglo-Saxon onomastics, and Mistress Keridwyn (Lady Harpy) will teach on some aspect of Welsh onomastics. Lord Talan, Dragon Principal Herald of the Midrealm, will be teaching a class on doing name research in a language with which you are unfamiliar. Master Bruce Draconarius will teach a heraldic class.

The Medieval Kerald:

A Partner in Chivalry by Deirdre O'Siodhachain

While the herald was to grow to be an indispensable partner in the practice of chivalry, his origins were in fact quite humble. The development of the herald is inextricably linked with the tournament. There is no record of heralds in areas or times where the tournament was not present. The first heralds are mentioned in the middle part of the 12th century and were probably minstrels who learned that being familiar with the participents in the continental tournament circuit paid off. These minstrels would literally herald various knights onto the field with praises (or possible insults) based on their reputations as fighters and their generosity to the heralds. A herald's income came from the distribution of largesse and the sale of broken armor remaining after a joust. During the fighting, the heralds identified the fighters for the spectators and recorded the deeds of arms performed. Later, the deeds could be used to good purpose in earning a living by storytelling. In the 1170's, William the Marshall was said to have engaged a herald to follow him from tournament to tournament and always cry "God aid the Marshall!" when he entered the lists. This lead to a certain belief that the Marshall was a braggart and his prowess overrated. This belief did not last long, for William justly earned much of his early reputation and wealth from his tournament winnings.

As the usefulness of the heralds grew, their vagabond existence diminished. The best heralds became attached to noble households and served their lords by maintaining the house's dignity; the presence of a herald indicated that the lord had both the need and means to be in contact with other households who participated in or sponsored tournaments. These permanent heralds began to act as messengers between lords and also as officials of the tournament, with their specialized knowledge of armorial devices proving to be useful in both capacities. Though even with their increased importance, heralds remained classed and paid as if they were minstrels, according to household records throughout the 1300's.

Over time the tournament became more formalized and so did the role of the herald. The status of the office was no longer considered so lowly and gradually they were given greater responsibilities in more serious matters. Since much of the conduct of war reflected the conventions of the tournament field, it was only natural that heralds should be given the duty of delivering challenges, and declaring the victor and defeated in war. One of the earliest references to this occurred during the reign of Edward III of England. In 1338 the Carlilse King of Arms was returning from an extended journey on the continent. On the way he received a declaration of war and delivered it to Edward, who returned the compliment by using another herald to accept the challenge.

With the greater duties came greater social standing; men of good family now were appointed as heralds. Also required were men of good learning. As the complexities of heraldry increased,

(continued on page 19) page 18 heralds began to rely less on memory and keep written records. The requirements for knighthood and participation in a tournament had become sufficiently restrictive that it was necessary to prove descent from four noble families to be accepted. The heralds acted as judges to determine the validity of any claims, most of which were presented by displaying four different sets of arms. The heralds had to verify each set.

Even as the kings of the later middle ages found it expedient to bind the duties of knighthood more closely to the monarch, so it was with the heralds. Gradually there developed three classes of herald, the highest being the King of Arms. The King of Arms went through a form of coronation, was expected to swear an oath of fealty, and was often given heraldic authority over a geographic area called a "march" and all heralds practicing in that area.











At their height, heralds were the ultimate authority on chivalry, acting as arbitrators in chivalric disputes. There is a famous incident at one of the many English seiges of Calais where two noblemen submitted their dispute to two Kings of Arms. When their judgement was given, the English king upheld and enforced their ruling- there was no appeal.

Heralds and knightly matters remained closely associated throughout even the later middle ages. At a pas d'armes in 1493,

the heralds assigned each participant the (mythical) arms of one of King Artur's knights. However, tournaments and jousting had lost much of their popularity and gradually fell into decline. Even with this lack of tournaments, the heralds still had much work. They had evolved into a self- perpetuating bureaucracy. Various wonarchs would send out their principal King of Arms to perform "visitations." These visitations were meant to ensure the purity of traditional heraldry among established families, grant correct heraldry to the newly ennobled, and remove those who unjustly claimed arms. Almost by accident, heralds played the role of historian, because by their work the arms, genealogy, and history of many families were preserved.



The April meeting will be at the home of Lord Stefan of Cambion, and the May meeting will be at Rutland Manor, the home of James and Daniel.


