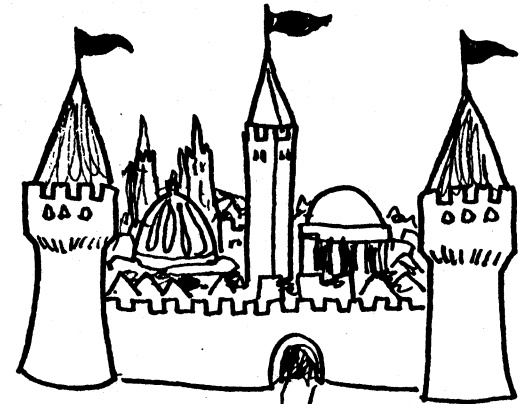
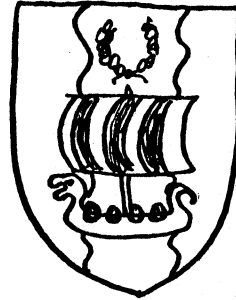
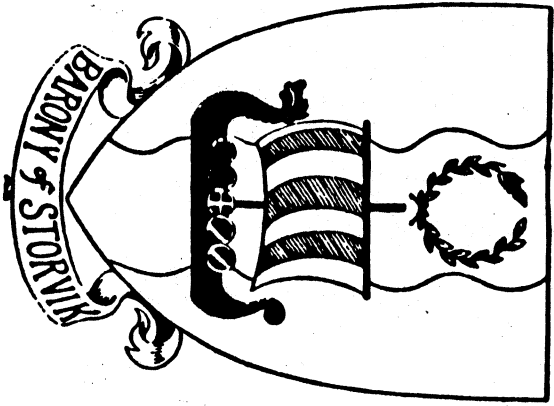

Get in the right-hand lane, and cross over 410 onto Queens Chapel Road. Go through the light at the top of the hill, and make the next right onto Oliver Street.

**From The City:** Take North Capitol Street to Michigan Avenue. (Look for the signs to Providence Hospital and the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception). Turn right onto Michigan. It will become Queens Chapel Rd when it leaves the District. Oliver street is approx. 5.4 miles from the intersection of North Capitol and Michigan. You will eventually pass through a shopping district (a shopping center, gas stations, a Pizza Hut, etc). Queens chapel road then goes up a very noticeable hill. Oliver street is on the other side of the hill, at the bottom, on the left. If you reach Route 410 (East-West Highway), you have gone too far. If so, cross 410, turn around, and follow the 'from the Capital Beltway' directions above.

***Artifacts and Heirlooms***

The Board of Directors meeting will include a display of older SCA articles that have some history behind them, please bring your old armor, maps, first scroll, etc for display.

The Investiture of Master Niäll McKennet and Mistress Teleri Talgellawg as Baron and Baroness of Ponte Alto was a event filled with celebration, good food, and many people. The day started with a duello "second blood" tourney, and then a games tourney. Then Atlantian Royal Court of Galmr and Katharina opened with a Military flag procession of Ponte Alto, accompanied by the sound of dumbeks. Their majesties started court by presenting scrolls for awards previously given out. Then they awarded arms to Ranulf of Waterford and Padraig Muadhan, and William Conor MacLean was appointed to the Queen's Order of Courtesy.

Lady Winifred Corbet de Wynterwood, as the seneschal of Ponte Alto asked for release from the status of a canton of Storvik. King Galmr stated that one barony can no longer hold all the good energy of the area, and that their should be two baronies. The Baron and Baroness of Storvik were summoned and did return the lands south of the river, known as Ponte Alto, to the crown. Then King Galmr made a royal proclamation that henceforth, there would be a new barony in the Kingdom of Atlantia, known as Ponte Alto (the actual document is gorgeous). The officers of Ponte Alto were called forth. Then it was asked "Who shall be the Baron and Baroness of this new Barony?", and accompanied by drums, following saracen guards, Master Niäll and Mistress Teleri presented themselves. Their Majesties asked if it was the people's will to have Master Niäll and Mistress Teleri as their Baron and Baroness, and there was a great cry of "Vivat!"

Master Niäll McKennet and Mistress Teleri Telgellawg were then sworn into their oaths of office and given coronets and tokens of trust by their majesties. The new Baron and Baroness then held their first Baronial court, confirming their officers and appointing Lord Brion du Bois Betronne as Captain of War, Lord Padraig Muadhan as Captain of the Guard, Signor Niccolo Aldobrandini as Steward of the Baronial Household, and Lord Maelgwyn y Traseiliur as Wardrober. They also exchanged gifts with the Baron and Baroness of Storvik, explaining that Ponte Alto has been proud to be part of Storvik, but it is time for new beginnings, time of great hopes and some sadness at leaving Storvik.

## ***SCA Board of Directors Meeting in Storvik***

The Board of Directors of the Society for Creative Anachronism will be holding its April quarterly meeting in the Barony of Storvik. This is a rare opportunity to see firsthand how the whole international organization is run. The Board only meets four times a year, usually in California. April will only be the second time in 25 years that they have met in this area.

The meeting itself will be Sunday, April 26, 1992, at 10:00 a.m. in the New Carrollton, Md., City Hall. It holds 300 and is conveniently located about a mile from the Washington Beltway (Route 495). Take Route 450 East (Exit 20A) and immediately get in the two left lanes to turn left at the intersection onto Princess Garden Parkway. The City Hall is a few blocks ahead on the left in a brick building. No reservations or garb are necessary. Lunch will be available.

On Saturday evening, April 25, 1992, the Barony of Storvik will host a feast for all, with dancing afterwards. This will be a chance to meet the Directors informally, all of whom have a great deal of experience in the Society. Newcomers are especially welcome.

Master Igor Bear has agreed to cook the feast (I told you this was an authorized copy!). Because we are vegetarian and keep kosher at our house, the feast will be ovo-lacto-vegetarian; and do not bring feast gear-- we importing platters of papyrus from Egypt to add an exotic note. The site is wet, wet, wet, but we reserve the right to take away your car keys if...

Several notes of interest; wear field garb, weather permitting, we will be out on the lawn under the sycamores enjoying the breezes and a view that includes two kingdoms until dinner.

Parents of smalls should be aware that it may be tedious for them to stay quiet during performances, and should plan accordingly. There will be a room set aside for their use.

## ***The Board is coming! The Board is coming!*** ***(so what does it all mean?)***

The SCA Board is meeting in Storvik; what does that mean? Who will be here, and what will they be doing? Can you go? What will happen?

### **The Board and the Board Meeting**

SCA, Inc. is a nonprofit, educational corporation. We're incorporated in California as a "non-member corporation," which means that the Board is empowered to make corporate decisions without calling meetings of the full membership. (Imagine trying to get 20,000+ SCA members together for a business meeting...) Once a quarter the Board meets to conduct the business of SCA Inc. The Board meeting is open; any SCA member is welcome to attend.

### **So what happens?**

Generally the meeting starts as close to 10 am as possible. The Directors and Officers sit at a U-shaped table (or tables) in the front, facing the audience. After brief introductions, we go right into the agenda. The first two sections are *Establishing the Agenda* and *Approving the Minutes*; they usually go very quickly. The third section is *Reports*, from officers and standing committees. Directors and officers present oral summaries of their written reports; the Board may ask clarifying questions, but there's little discussion --- topics needing further attention are moved to Old or New Business. The fourth section, *Recurring Business*, usually goes quickly: bank authorizations, reports of branch advancements (Ponte Alto should be on the agenda!), review of Director and officer status, etc. Barring calamities, we should finish the first four sections by the lunch break, which generally comes around noon or 1 pm and is as short as humanly possible.

## ***Details of the Board Meeting, continued...***

The bulk of the day is spent on sections 5 and 6, *Old Business* and *New Business*. These are the meat of the agenda, and the topics are very wide-ranging. At the January 1992 meeting the topics on the final agenda were:

For each topic, a Director or officer gives a summary of the background. We discuss it, present alternatives, ask for further information, propose solutions. If time permits, and audience members are interested, we open up some topics for *brief* comments from the floor. When it looks as though we've reached consensus, the Chairman summarizes the discussion and the agreement for the whole Board to verify. If the topic requires a formal motion (for example, a change to *Corpora*), a Director makes the motion; if another seconds, there's one more chance for discussion, and then the Board (but not the officers) votes. If we don't reach a consensus, or key information is not available, the topic will be remanded to a future meeting; one or more Directors or officers may be assigned "action items" to work on. Some topics require no action, and are simply dropped from the agenda.

*Details of the Board Meeting, continued...*

Section 7, Correspondence, is simply an opportunity to review any other correspondence that has come in during the quarter.

The Executive Session is section 8 of the agenda, but can be called at any point in the meeting. This is a private meeting of the Directors, to discuss some internal or sensitive topic. It is most often used for the selection of new Directors; in January we used it to elect a Vice-Chairman. We already know that there will be an Executive Session at the end of the April meeting, since Melinda Sherbring's term ends then and we must choose a replacement.

When we meet away from the corporate offices in California, we try to leave time at the end of the agenda for an open question-and-answer period. If you have questions or comments about topics not on the agenda, that's the time to bring them up.

If all goes well, the meeting should end around 6 pm.

Tips & Tidbits

The Directors and officers are in an odd situation at these meetings. As representatives of SCA Inc., we are 20th-century people, operating a 20th-century corporation. We use modern names and wear modern business dress. But at the event Saturday night we'll be medieval people; we'll use our SCA names and titles, and wear our best garb.

You can help a great deal by making that same distinction. On Saturday night there will be a dozen or so visitors in Storvik, notable peers from other kingdoms who don't know Atlantia or her people. Please take the initiative in welcoming them and doing them honor --- strike up conversations, ask them to dance, help them find seats for the feast. They'll feel much more comfortable, and you may end up with tales to tell your friends!

On Sunday, you don't have to wear garb --- any comfortable modern clothes are fine. You'll get copies of the Agenda, and be asked to sign in so that we can include your name in the minutes. You might want to bring a quiet craft: there can be stretches where things get, well, boring, and conversation would be distracting.

If you want to comment on an agenda item, please be understanding. We'll open things up as much as possible, but we have to get through a lot of material --- we may not be able to hear from everyone, or open up every topic. If you're called on, your time will be limited; be ready to make your points as succinctly as you can.

Finally, I'm very glad that Storvik has offered to host this meeting. I think you'll find it interesting to see how the Board works; and I know the Board will find it valuable to meet you and hear what you think. If you have any questions between now and then, I'm in *TI*.

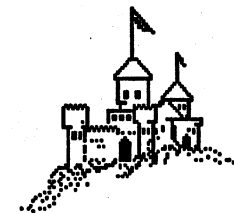
