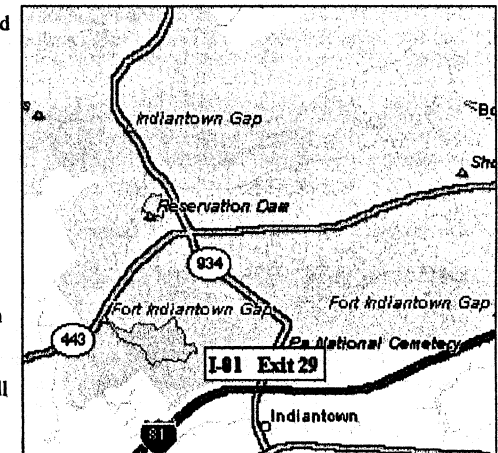
Merchants are encouraged, and the only merchant fee is a donated item for raffle.

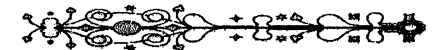
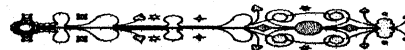
Directions:

Take your best route to I-81. Take exit 29 North (Fort Indiantown Gap). Go one half mile and turn right onto Asher Miner road (there will be a Funk's Market/Texaco on the right). Go to the first stop sign (at route 443). Go straight - this will be Route 443 East. Proceed 3.8 miles - camp Bashore will be on the right.



Important Note from the Chronicler of Storvik:

In looking at this map, it may seem that the directions given are impossible. Specifically, all the maps I have had access to show Asher Miner Rd to begin at the intersection of Rtes 934 and 443. Asher Miner Rd apparently is Rte 443, even though the directions given above when compared to the map do not appear to match. I strongly suggest that you either get confirmation from other sources as to the correct directions or that you ask directions when you get off Interstate 81.

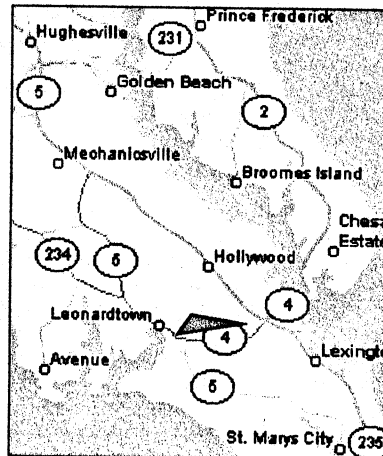

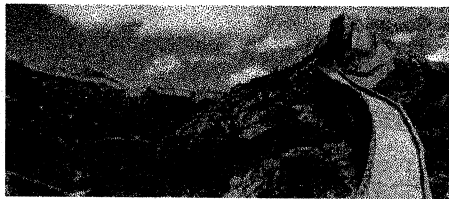

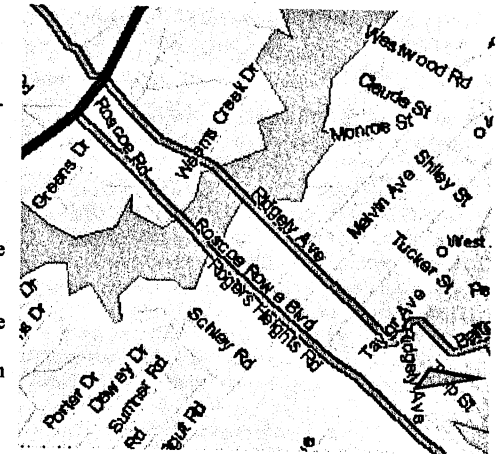
In the evening we will dine on roasted pig cooked whole over an open fire in the huntsman's tradition, and tell stories of arrows split in the heat of friendly competition.

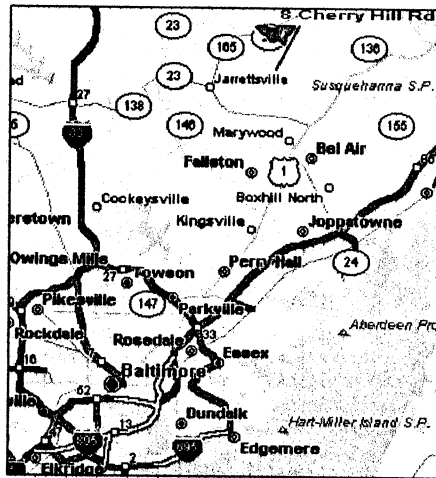

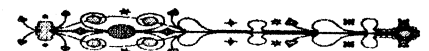
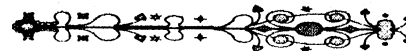
