



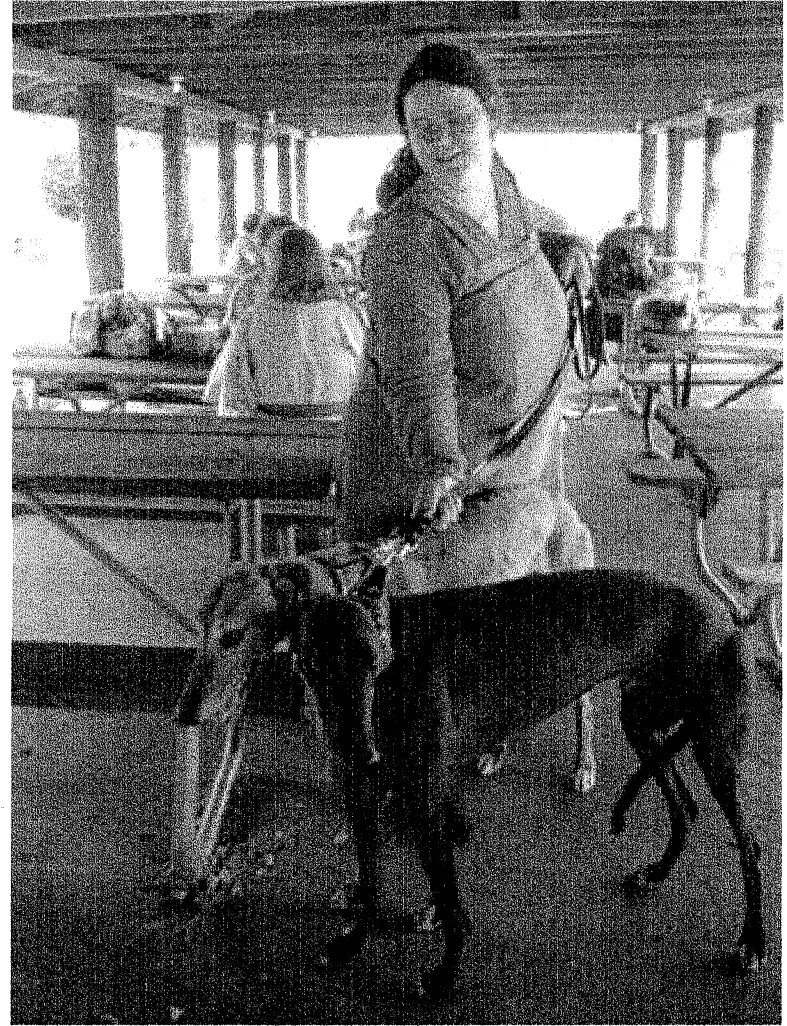

### An Apology and a Thank You from your Chronicler (Again)

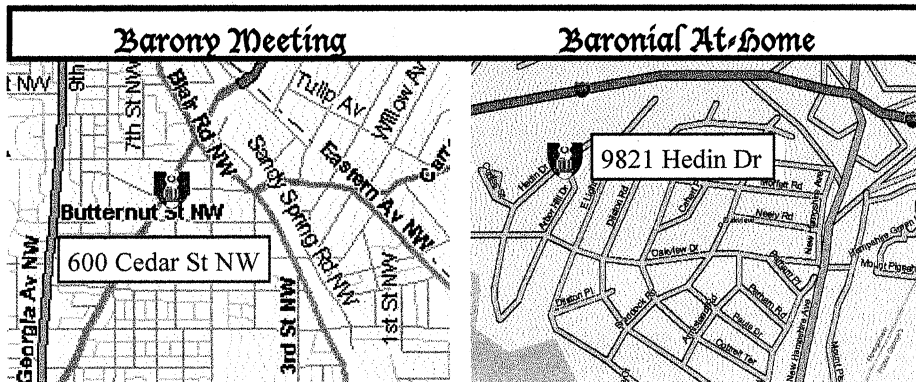

Investiture: Brenna (autocrat) – March 26. No site yet but specifics given for what we are looking for in a site: room & parking somewhere nearby for 250 with kitchen facilities inside the boundaries of Storvik; it's a plus to allow alcohol, allow heavy fighting and pavilions

Yule Revel: January 1st with doors opening at 1pm – Tirzah (autocrat). Main entertainment: games. Dessert competition: Best period & non-period dessert; Kim looking for volunteer to take this over as she will not be able to attend event Correction on date going out to Acorn week; it's listed as January 15th instead Feast: Connie, Orla, Dee are combined cooks & will come up with something yummy & warm. Rental contract with church already secure with old pricing so shouldn't affect cost. Budget for event to be provided by Tirzah before end of the week so pricing can be listed in the event announcement (to be on the Storvik meal plan). Camp fees to be determined.

**Old Business:**

Coronet repairs: Johanna still working on it; person hasn't gotten back to her yet.

Kitchen Committee: Still looking to replace items; said cost would be between \$400 to replace what we currently have or between \$700-800 for nice stuff (based on equipment needed for feast for Storvik events (80 people) or sponsoring kingdom level events with 150+ people attending). Fundraising brought up as an idea. Rhiryd asked the committee to actively look into price per item as well as suggestions to be brought forward for next month's business meeting

**New Business:**

Kim (Minister of Arts & Sciences) & James (Castellan) to be giving up offices at the end of their two years in April or possibly as soon as January depending on mundane family circumstances; offices given up to pursue others avenues and has nothing to do with current polling situation – looking for deputies or volunteers now with caution that both offices have a lot of stuff that needs to be stored; Kim had several candidates come forward

The backbone of Il Palio are Siena's 17 Contrade, which are the city wards designated to aid the many military companies hired to defend Siena's fiercely-earned independence from other nearby city states. The horses tear around the Piazza del Campo at breakneck speed, and they and their jockeys wear the colors and designs of the Contrade: Tortoise, Wave, She-Wolf, Goose, Shell, Porcupine, Dragon, Owl, Snail, Panther, Eagle, Caterpillar, Unicorn, Ram, Giraffe, Forest and Tower. So come join us and race a horse or simply join a Contrade and cheer for your favorite horseman!

## Dun Carraig: Baronial Birthday, November 20

Come one, come all, and join Dun Carraig in celebrating the Feast of Saint Felix, and, coincidentally, celebrating our eleventh year as a barony. Saint Felix of Valois, along with Saint John of Matha, founded the Order of the Holy Trinity for the Ransom of Captives, or the Trinitarians, a religious order dedicated to ransoming Christian slaves who were captured during the Crusades.

To honor Saint Felix, who was a warrior in the Crusades before becoming a holy man, we are holding a warrior's Pentathlon, giving fighters a chance to showcase their broad range of talents. This will consist of tournaments for heavy, rapier, archery and thrown weapons. To be eligible to win the Pentathlon title, a fighter must take part in three of the four combat events, plus one of the A&S events. There will be opportunities to authorize for combat archery, and chances for combat archers to partake in the heavy fighting scenarios. The rapier tournament will

be a 'dice tourney', with weapon forms and fight scenarios chosen at random for each competitor. Archery will consist of royal rounds and a mix of dynamic shoots to test the seasoned bowman. And don't forget your throwing cutlery. Their Excellencies, the Baron & Baroness of Dun Carraig, will be choosing their Champions from those that enter the Tourneys, and prizes will also be awarded to the winners of the individual tourneys, as well as for the Most Chivalrous Fighter.

There will be three parts to the A&S activities. First, a general A&S display. Second, in the spirit of St. Felix, will be several contests--Best Reliquary, Best Coin, and Best Religious Item or Icon. This last can be in any medium. Those warriors wishing to qualify for the Pentathlon must enter either the display or any one of these competitions. Finally (just for fun), there will be a Best Castle competition at the feast. The Contestants (gentles at each table) will assemble a castle using materials found in their "lands": sugar cubes (bricks), frosting (mortar), decorations, etc (fruit roll-ups, pretzels, etcetera). However, as in life, resources may not be evenly distributed, so negotiations with your neighboring "countries" may be required for additional supplies. 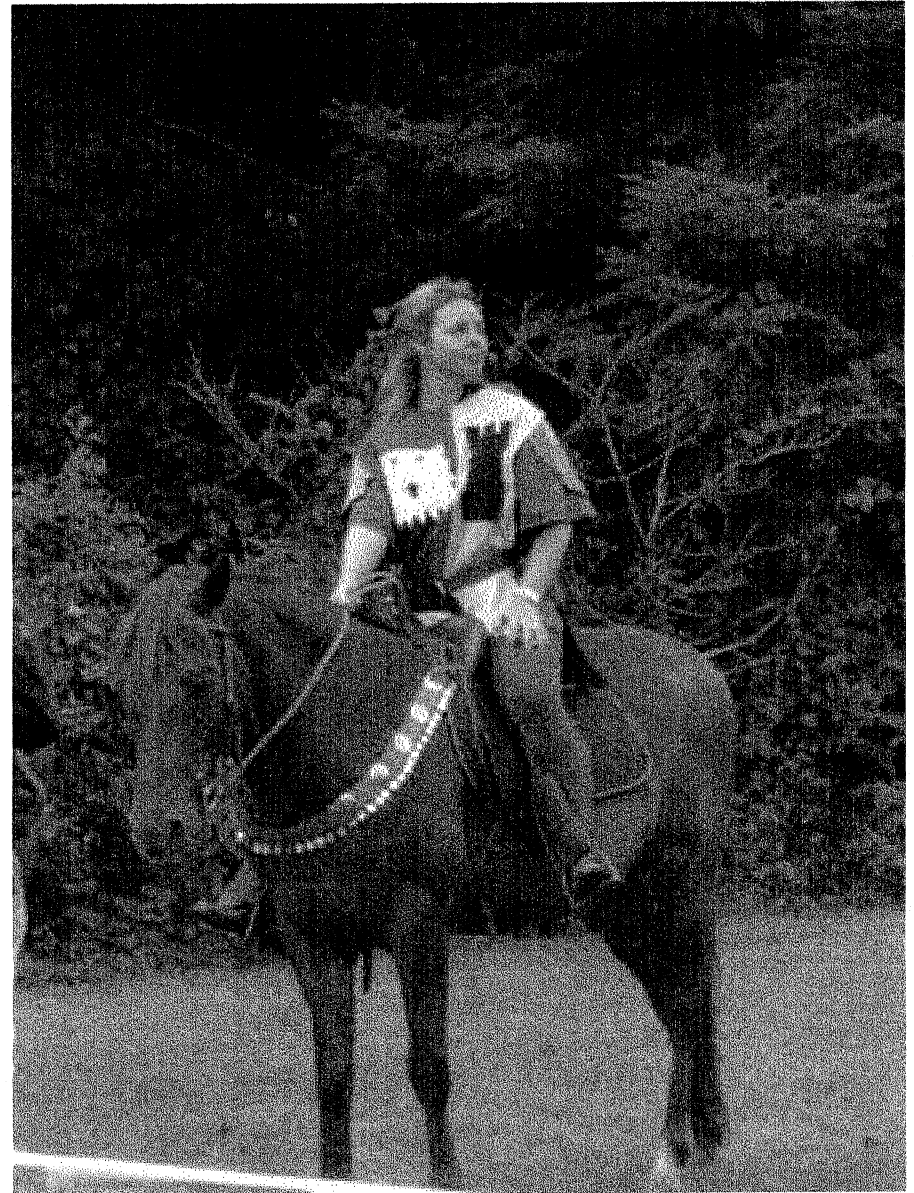
