

Directions to the site:

From the South: Take your best route to I-95 north of Richmond. Take the exit for Fort A.P. Hill to Rt. 301. Go North on Rt. 301, crossing the Potomac River into Maryland across the toll bridge (\$1.50 toll payable upon leaving Maryland). Roughly 4 miles north of the bridge, take a right onto Rt. 234. Follow this to Leonardtown. Merge right onto Rt. 5. Take the Rt. 5 Bypass around Leonardtown. Leonardtown Middle School is on the right on Rt. 5, roughly 2 miles on the other side of Leonardtown.

From Maryland and Northern VA: Take your best route to Rt. 4 South into Calvert County. This could be the Exit 11 off the D.C. Beltway (Pennsylvania Ave. South), from Rt. 301 in Upper Marlboro, or Rt. 2 South from Annapolis. Take Rt. 4 through Calvert County, crossing the bridge at Solomons Island into St. Mary's County. Go through the first stop light after the bridge and stay on Rt. 4 until it ends in a T-intersection roughly six miles after the stop light. Turn left onto Rt. 5, heading South. Leonardtown Middle School is on the right on Rt. 5, roughly 2 miles after the turn off Rt. 4.

Approximate commuting times: 45 minutes to an hour from the MD/VA coming from the South. Roughly 2 hours from the DC Beltway. Roughly 2 hours and 45 minutes from Baltimore.

Crash space: Some limited crash space is available with members of the Barony. Include crash space requests (and SASE for directions) with your reservation, noting any pet allergies or smoking preferences. In additions, arrangements have been made with a hotel in the area, the Patuxent Inn on Rt. 235 in Lexington Park, MD. Our group rate is \$43.00 per room per night. The rooms typically sleep up to 4 adults, but there is no charge for additional occupants in a room. For hotel reservations, contact the Patuxent Inn directly at (301) 862-4100. They will accept collect calls and send you directions upon request. Tell them that you are with the SCA and you will receive the group rate. Reserve before August 19 to get into the block of rooms they've set aside for us. After that date, you will still get the group rat e if there are any rooms available. If we reserve more than 20 rooms, they will set aside a Hospitality Room for us.

A PLAU REVIEW by Stefan of Cambion

Shakespeare fans -- think you know Othello and Romeo and Juliet? Wait until you see "Goodnight Desdemona, Good Morning Juliet" at the Wooly Mammoth Theatre. Just imagine that Romeo and Juliet discover that they are actually incompatible, or that Othello meets someone who knows the plot. the premise involves a long-suffering graduate student who has been working on her thesis that the two tragedies were originally written as comedies, and Shakespeare deleted some of the characters and scenes. Also, that Desdemona and Juliet are the true tragic figures in the plays, not Othello and Romeo.

These are by no means accurate renditions, although a number of scenes are included (sometimes not with the standard characters or staging). When the student finally gets to step into the action and talk with the characters to find out the truth, many strang and hilarious things happen. For instance, Juliet has a balcony scene, but she is the pursuer in the garden and the student is on the balcony.

The play lasts 2 1/2 hours (with a 15 minute intermission), but the level of entertainment stays high and there is no sense of it being long. With only seven rows of seats, you are right there with the players.

The Washington Post lauded it as "Brainy but breathlessly funny."

A passing knowledge of the plays helps to get some of the lines, but is not essential to enjoying the show.

"Goodnight Desdemona, Good Morning Juliet" runs through October 16 at the Wooly Mammoth Theatre, 1401 Church Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. It is five blocks from the Dupont Circle Metro station and there is on street parking. Tickets are \$12.00 to \$27.00, although volunteering to usher gets you in free (202) 393-3939

Real Men May Wear Tights A dramatic evening with the Masters of the Sword

Quarterstaves, double-handed broadswords, battle axes and military sabers...all sparkle in the theatrical lights illuminating the Baird Auditorium stage as Patrick Crean, the "Dean" of both the Society of American Fight Directors and Fight Directors of Canada, and Henry Marshal, convener and co-founder of the Society of British Fight Directors, face off to bring the thrilling action, history, art and illusion of stage combat to life.

Staged fight demonstrations from the Medieval, Elizabethan and Baroque periods are complemented by TV and film clips from such classics as Errol Flynn's The Master of Ballantrae (in which Mr. Crean played Errol Flynn's double).

Quips and anecdotes by the distinguished master fighters, and the opportunity to ask questions about the art of the sword, comprise this exciting evening moderated by Brad Waller, who has choreographed fights for the Arena Stage and the Shakespeare Theatre and teaches stage combat at the Shakespeare Theatre, Catholic University, and George Mason University.

Patrick Crean has acted with and arranged fights for such theatrical luminaries as Trevor Howard, John Gielgud, Paul Scofield, Laurence Olivier, Michael Redgrave, Ralph Richardson and Alec Guiness. Henry Marshall is the Master of Arms at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art and the author of <u>Stage Swordplay</u>.

Other master participants in this dramatic turn-of-the-century-style lecture-demonstration are stage fight and movement specialists Edward Rozinsky, who came to the U.S. from the Leningrad Theatrical University; Jonathan Howell, chairman of the Society of British Fight Directors; and Franklyn White, a ballet fighter.
