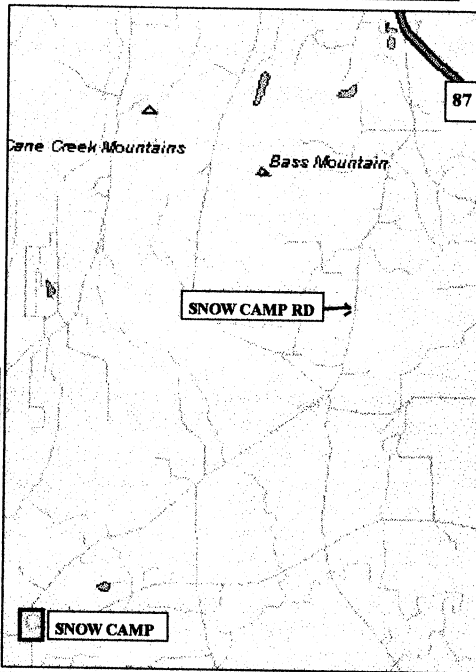
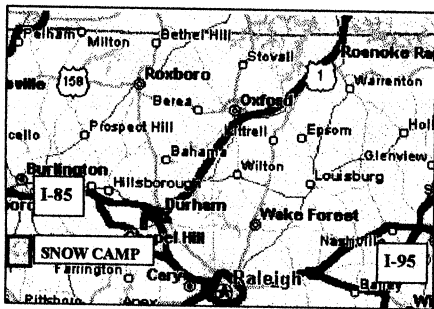


## Coronation of Anton & Luned (Cont.)

### The Sackler and Freer Galleries (Continued):

Sackler—The Buddha's Art of Healing (Opens August 2) features 17 paintings from an extraordinary illustrated medical treatise that remains one of the greatest surviving treasures of Tibetan civilization. The exhibition examines the iconography and vast corpus of medical knowledge that constitute Tibetan medicine and its unusual concept of treatment, which interweaves spiritual, magical, and rational healing practices.

Sculpture of South and Southeast Asia: A group of 10th- to 13th-century Cambodian stone sculptures complements a display of Hindu stone, bronze, brass, and terra-cotta sculptures from South India dating from the 8th through the 14th century.

Freer—Japan: Seto & Mino Ceramics (Through Dec. 1998) Daily, 10:00 am to 5:30 pm

Japanese Art in the Age of Koetsu (Through January 3, 1999) Koetsu's distinctive style, as reflected in his calligraphy, handcrafted Raku-ware tea bowls and lacquer design, had an immediate and lasting impact on Japanese aesthetic traditions. This exhibition of painting, calligraphy, ceramics, and lacquer illuminates the cultural and historical context that produced some of Japan's most beautiful and enduring works of art.

Masterworks of Indian Painting II (January 10, 1999) This new selection of Indian paintings are masterpieces from the Mughal dynasty (1526-1858) and the Rajput courts that controlled northern and western India between the 17th and 19th centuries.
