### Arts Workshop

The HOUSE ALLIANCE welcomes one and all to our NOVEMBER ARTS WORKSHOP, POTLUCK DINNER, and BARDIC CIRCLE, which will be held on Nov. 21st, from 1:00 - 5:00 pm, at the home of Mistress Tuiren de Lisle, at 444 Sugarland Run Drive, in Sterling, VA - (704) 430-6569. (PARENTS PLEASE NOTE: Because of the large numbers of children who have attended past workshops, we are asking that parents planning to bring children please contact Beth Johnson in advance, to discuss hiring a sitter to supervise the children during the workshop, or to offer other suggestions on how to occupy the small ones during the day and evening).

The November Workshop will be a one-day Calligraphy class on the Irish Uncial hand (see the title of this announcement), taught by Mistress Tuiren. Because an entire hand will be covered in only a few hours, it would help if you have had some previous experience in calligraphy, and perhaps have learned another hand already. However, everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend the workshop - even beginners can learn something from it. Participants in the workshop should bring their own materials: calligraphy practice pad or ordinary tracing paper, plus calligraphy pen with Broad Tip (C-3 or equivalent). Felt-tip calligraphy pens are usable, but be warned they will not produce as clear and crisp a letter form.

The POTLUCK, a regular feature of House Alliance Workshop Weekends, will run from 5:30 - 7:00 pm, with the Bardic Circle following. We ask that those attending the Potluck bring a dish (medieval would be very nice, but not absolutely necessary) which can feed at least 6. We usually change into garb for dinner and the Bardic Circle - plan to bring your own Feast Gear, also.

At 7:00, we will begin the BARDIC CIRCLE. Anyone is welcome to either entertain (with music, poetry, story-telling, readings, etc.) or just come and enjoy. Period and/or Traditional entertainment would be nice, but is certainly not mandatory. For those who would like to participate, but not as soloists, there will be sheet music for group songs and rounds.

FROM THE EAST - Take the Beltway (495) around DIRECTIONS: to Exit 10 (Leesburg Pike/Rte 7) west. Get off at Rt. 7 (Leesburg Pike) and head West, for what seems like forever. You will pass the turnoff for Reston, and then pass the Towncenter Shopping Center, with a stoplight on each end. Keep going, passing the stoplight at Rt. 846 (Sterling Blvd). The next stoolight will the the intersection of Rt. 7 and Rt. 637 (Potomac View Rd). Turn right onto 637 (the Northern Virginia Community College will be on your left). Stay in the right lane, and it will shortly become a mandatory right-turn lane, forcing you to make the right turn into the SUGARLAND RUN subdivision. This will put you on Sugarland Run Drive. Stay on this road, going straight, and follow it around the subdivision, until you come to #444, a dark green ranch-house on the left.

FROM THE SOUTH: Get onto Rt. 28 (Sully Road) heading north, and follow it until it deadeands onto Rt. 7 (Leesburg Pike). Turn right onto Rt. 7 (heading east) and go to the 2nd stoplight (just beyond the entrance to the NOVA college campus). There, turn left onto Rt. 637 (Potomac View Road), and follow directions as above to the SUGARLAND RUN subdivision.

 $\overline{\text{FROM}}$   $\overline{\text{THE}}$  WEST: Get onto Rt. 7, going east. Pass Rt. 28, and go beyond it to the 2nd stoplight (just beyond the NOVA college campus). Then follow directions as above.

### Bhakail-In-Exile Yule Feast and Revel

to be held on December 5th, A.S. XXII, at St. George's Church on the western marches of the Barony of Storvik. And it was decided that there would be much Food (Bhakailis are fond of Food), prepared with skill and in great quantity by the noble Lord Geoffrei de Courville. And the cost for this day of merriment and good cheer would be but 10 Tygers\*, and a mere 3 Tygers for those who chose not to dine. The hall would be damp, so that gentles might bring their favorite drinks.

The Hall shall open an hour before noon. The day shall be filled with games and forfeits and competitions and dancing, and perhaps an exhibition by the East Kingdom Academy of Fence. Among these will be a contest in the decorative needle arts (embroidery and the like), and a contest for the Finest Subteltie on the subject of Salamanders, Warthogs, or Moose. There might be a story-telling or musical competition, and we certainly hope that gentles will bring instruments and music for the enjoyment of all. At some point in the day there will be a contest for the gentle with the best legs, who will by this feet (as it were) become Baron for the Day. After the Feast, there will be more Dancing, until one hour before midnight, when all must leave and make their way to their lodgings.

\* <u>Tyger</u> - a coin in common use throughout the East Kingdom, of approximately equal value to the Atlantian Clam.

Once again, the Feast will be:

On-board: 10 Tygers before November 23rd, and 12 Tygers before Nov. 30; available afterwards only by cancellations and the whim of the Autocrat.

Off-board: 3 Tygers before Nov. 30th, and 5 Tygers thereafter. Unfortunately we cannot guarantee off-board seating during the feast.

In memory of a short, thick person, puce warthogs will be admitted free.

Clothing the Pint-Sized Medievalist or
How Not To Go Broke Keeping Your Child in Garb

As all parents know, children grow at a formidable rate. As a result, the garb you so carefully constructed in April for the warm weather can be woefully outgrown by Pensic. So, how do you arrange to get at least enough wear from the clothing to justify its creation?

One time-honored technique is to set up a clothing exchange in your local area. This works well if your locale is over-run with children. But what if your area has few other children or everyone else is into Tudor and you are a family of good Saxons? Or that the available garb is of whatever colors your family looks terrible in? This article will attempt to solve a portion of this problem.

I have more experience with girl's garb so I'll start with the young ladies. Children usually grow much more in height than in width in the short term. The first step is to allow adequate hems in all the garb. When your child grows taller, let the hem out and cover the old edge with trim. If the garb is later period and there is a separate bodice, build in a generous seam at the waist-line. Young girls do not as yet have any complex geometry to deal with so letting the bodice out at the waist will still fit. Sleeves also need to have adequate hems. Again, trim can cover any wear marks from the old length. Allow extra in the shoulder seam, particularly in vest-like garments. This way, the armhole will enlarge when you add the extra length.

Necklines can be somewhat tricky. Children have heads that are significantly larger in proportion to their bodies than adults. You usually can't just make a pull-over top, but need some type of slit to keep the dress from falling off over the shoulders. If the neck becomes too tight, a judicious re-cutting of the neck slit will provide enough room to breathe.

Although not as dramatic, allowance must be made for some increase in width. Deep side seams and generous seams in the sleeves will give you enough material to expand sideways when necessary.

Most of the expansion notes for girls also can apply to boys. Boys, mostly by virtue of having simpler garb, are somewhat easier to deal with. Early on, they don't mind if their tunics look more like gowns. As they grow, the belted tunic simply gets shorter with fewer folds at the belt.

Trouser-like garments have several dimensions to consider. As always, leave extra in the hems. Fine, this gets the leg long enough, but what about the crotch measurement? If it is a gathered waist, I have found that leaving enough fabric to make a pleat around the waist just under the gathering fold is a convenient site to hide the extra length. Waist bands are more difficult, but not impossible. Extra width can be hidden in a generous overlap for fastening, or in a pleat along the lenth of the waistband. The pleat for length will still work, but the fullness isn't hidden as well. Leave fabric for increased width along the outer side seam.

Particularly during earlier periods, construction techniques and basic styles were unisex which makes solving the growth problem easier. Later periods do pose something of a problem if you indulge in dagging hems or in some other way make letting hems out difficult. Heavy fabrics also make leaving extra fabric in the seams uncomfortable and bulky.

When making garb for children, you must take the individual child into account. I know that my daughter loves to look pretty, but also will not put up with anything tight around her waist, even belts. She is also very active and doesn't want to be inhibited by her clothing or for it to be too hot to wear. It also MUST be easily washed. Other children will have their own set of idiosyncrasies to deal with. It is up to the seamstress to take all this into account and to make clothing for each child that is wearable and is created to last. I have some garb for my daughter that I made when she was 3 that still is wearable at 5. I am now making clothing that should last equally long.
