On April 1-3, Storvikii staffed a table at CostumeCon 40 in Bethesda, Maryland. It was a small (300 persons) costume oriented convention. We connected with many people that were former scadians as well as seven new people who were interested in us.

Murder Hobos of History: Caravaggio

murder hobo, noun: A mercenary character who makes their way through the world by killing other people and taking their stuff

Strictly speaking, Caravaggio wasn't a murder hobo. He was an artist, a massively influential one, whose use of light and shadow revolutionized Western European art. He did, however, live the murder hobo life, with many a tavern brawl, a lengthy arrest record, and a few murders to his name. His career was repeatedly interrupted by jail time and desperate escapes from cities where he was wanted by the law.

Caravaggio learned to paint in Milan, Italy, under the tutelage of Simone Peterzano, himself said to be a student of Titian, another Big Art Name. Caravaggio had to hit the road for Rome in the early 1590s after he got into some fights, possibly even killing someone, and wounded a police officer. This sort of thing would become a theme for him.

In Rome, without much in the way of resources or connections, he got a job in a workshop, turning out still lives of fruit and other stock images. He - guess what - got into an argument with the head of the workshop and struck out on his own. He made some friends who hooked him into the Roman art scene, including making connections to wealthy buyers. At least one of those friends also introduced him to Roman street-brawling, which he found a natural fit.

In 1600, he beat up a nobleman, resulting in an official complaint and jail time. He was released and turned out a few masterpieces. Mannerist painting was the dominant style in Italy at the time, and a very stylized style it was. It was self-consciously artificial, using distorted forms, strange colors, and often elongated, unreal anatomy. Caravaggio brought a more northern European realism, and deployed tenebrism, a heightened form of chiaroscuro (Italian for "light-shadow") technique to stunning effect. Important characters are practically spotlit, emerging from dramatic shadows around them. It was divisive - people either loved it or hated it - and Caravaggio was a sensation.

Nevertheless, in between creating works that upended the art world, he found the time to write offensive poems about another painter. The painter sued Carravaggio and his friends, Caravaggio went back to jail, but was transferred to house arrest after the French ambassador intervened. And after that, he was the subject of complaints for carrying a sword illegally, for assaulting the police again, and for throwing a plate of artichokes at a waiter. Finally, he had to flee Rome to Genoa after attacking a man in a dispute over a woman, Lena, who was Caravaggio's model and lover.

Speaking of Caravaggio's loves, many of his paintings are so deeply homoerotic that art historians think he was bisexual.

The good times continued to roll when he returned to Rome, after his patrons covered up the attack. His landlady sued him for back rent; he threw rocks at her window; she sued again. A bit after that, he ended up in the hospital with a serious injury from "falling on his own sword," which sounds a bit like "in an illegal fight I don't want to mention." Finally, after castrating and killing a very rich man in a duel (possibly over a woman, or a debt, or a game, or over politics - accounts vary), Caravaggio fled Rome for the last time. His patrons couldn't cover this one up, and Caravaggio headed south to avoid a beheading. He lived for four more years in several cities, still getting into fights, before he became ill and mentally disturbed - syphilis may have been to blame. He died in 1610.

Grant of Use Form: For articles, non-photograph artwork, most other contributions

Model Release Form: People appearing in photographs must sign this if:

- 1. The image is portrait-style
- 2. The photograph is taken in a private space at an event (such as a personal encampment)
- 3. The photograph is taken at a non-public venue (such as an armor-making workshop at a home)

No model release form is needed when the photograph is taken at a public place and in a public forum

(where there is no expectation of privacy), including:

- any SCA contest or competition, merchants' row, court, class, etc.

<u>Photo Release Form</u>: The photographer who takes a picture (of anything or anyone) must sign a release form.
