A&S Report - January 1st

We had another wonderful Thing at the Cheverly Community Center! I'm beyond thrilled that we are able to make use of this space - it allows us to offer more free, accessible activities to members of our Society. There were 20 people who joined us this time for an A&S workshop.

On New Years' Day, Dame Emma West joined us to lead a Banner Painting activity. We painted two Inspiration banners for Queen Mary Isabel to hand out at events in 2024. Banner painting is a great activity to do with a large group because many hands make light work! Your banner will come out best if you keep working from a "wet edge" - don't let the dye dry while you move on to another section or take a break, it may appear splotchy. When you have a team of 6-10 people working on the banner, though, there is always someone to sub in when you need a break!

The first thing we had to do was assemble some simple frames using PVC pipe. Dame Emma brought two frames for us to use, and we applied clips to them using rubber bands. The purpose of this step is to stretch the silk so the dye can spread evenly over the surface. The silk fabric was previously treated with a starch solution "resist", which fills the pores of the fabric so the dye is limited to the top layer of silk. In other methods of silk dyeing, resist is applied to the borders of shapes and then dye is used to fill them in (think "flood fill"). The main disadvantage of this technique is that the design will appear backwards on the reverse side. Using the starch solution allows the reverse side of the banner to be dyed in a different design (we didn't do this, but you *could*).

We painted two designs that were outlined by Dame Emma - the outline traced from a "cartoon". There were some parts that had to be a specific color (the Atlantian Populace Banner) and other parts that were a bit more open to interpretation. We separated out into two teams to work on the two banners and those people got to make the decisions for the colors. This is one of many ways that each inspiration banner is truly unique. Another aspect of uniqueness that many of us learned first hand - the dye is a bit unpredictable and there's no eraser. You can try your best but every banner is going to have some instances of "coloring outside the lines". Don't be discouraged though! If you consider the banner's usage in period, they're flying high and proud. Nobody's going over them up close and looking for mistakes!

Overall, it was a great time introducing many Storvikii and friends/neighbors to the world of banner painting! We had a lovely potluck snack station and plenty to go around, so thank you to all who attended. Beyond any productivity or educational goals, we enjoyed the day working together!

<u>Grant of Use Form</u>: For articles, non-photograph artwork, most other contributions

Model Release Form: People appearing in photographs must sign this if:

- 1. The image is portrait-style
- 2. The photograph is taken in a private space at an event (such as a personal encampment)
- 3. The photograph is taken at a non-public venue (such as an armor-making workshop at a home)

No model release form is needed when the photograph is taken at a public place and in a public forum

(where there is no expectation of privacy), including:

- any SCA contest or competition, merchants' row, court, class, etc.

<u>Photo Release Form</u>: The photographer who takes a picture (of anything or anyone) must sign a release form.
